**R This is the day that the Lord has made; we
will rejoice and be glad in it.**

Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good; his
mercy endures for ever. Let Israel now proclaim,
'His mercy endures for ever.' **R**

Open for me the gates of righteousness; I will
enter them; I will offer thanks to the Lord. 'This is
the gate of the Lord; whoever is righteous may
enter.' **R**

I will give thanks to you, for you answered me
and have become my salvation. The same stone
which the builders rejected has become the chief
corner-stone. **R**

This is the Lord's doing, and it is marvellous in
our eyes. On this day the Lord has acted; we will
rejoice and be glad in it. **R**

Hosanna, Lord, hosanna! Lord, send us now success. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord; we bless you from the house of the Lord. **R** God is the Lord; he has shined upon us; form a procession with branches up to the horns of the altar. 'You are my God and I will thank you; you are my God and I will exalt you.' Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good; his mercy endures for ever. **R**

Psalm 31:9-16

R I have trusted in you, O Lord. [I have said, 'You are my God.'] or R My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?

Have mercy on me, O Lord, for I am in trouble; my eye is consumed with sorrow, and also my throat and my belly. For my life is wasted with grief, and my years with sighing; my strength fails me because of affliction, and my bones are consumed. **R** I have become a reproach to all my enemies and even to my neighbours, a dismay to those of my acquaintance; when they see me in the street they avoid me. I am forgotten like the dead, out of mind; I am as useless as a broken pot. **R**

For I have heard the whispering of the crowd; fear is all around; they put their heads together against me; they plot to take my life. But as for me, I have trusted in you, O Lord. I have said, 'You are my God. **R**

My times are in your hand; rescue me from the hand of my enemies, and from those who persecute me. Make your face to shine upon your servant, and in your loving-kindness save me.' **R**
