Last Saturday I celebrated my Christmas present given to me by my daughter. It has become an annual event, when the "girls" in the family go to the Bristol Hippodrome to see a show. This year it was a revival of Jesus Christ Superstar, I had seen it many years ago, the ending being quite stark with Jesus on the cross. In this production the ending was very different, in that Jesus came down from the cross and knelt with Judas - a light shone between them, just theatrical effect you might think and yet the auditorium fell silent For a brief moment nobody seemed to breathe, one word came into my head - FORGIVENESS – a willingness to forgive.

In today's society when retribution and revenge is the thing should a willingness to forgive become central to our lives? As Christians we believe that we get it wrong, we sin. We may neglect to help someone, stop listening, and ignore their need. Sometimes our sin is what we fail to do, for example keeping quiet when we should speak out.

For Jesus, forgiveness was and is so important. Love comes first, Jesus wants us to love one another as he has loved us, but our love is imperfect, we sin and we damage our relationship with God and our neighbour, forgiveness then is the way back to love.

Jesus often spoke about forgiveness, forgave those who sinned against others, and against him and asked the disciples (the Church) to continue his ministry – Peter asked Jesus how often it was necessary to forgive and Jesus said to him "not seven times but, I tell you seventy seven times" (Matthew 18 v 22). A number meaning the never ending ways that we ought to forgive.

Jesus uses parables to illustrate various aspects of forgiveness, the prodigal son being the most illuminating. And on the cross Jesus intentionally forgives the Roman soldiers, who had scourged and nailed him, praying "Father forgive them" (Luke 25 v 24).

When we have been hurt by another it can be difficult to come to terms with how wounded we feel, but by accepting and embracing our wounds we can open a door to forgiveness and new life. Forgiveness helps us to move on, whereas revenge creates bitterness. Forgiving helps us to heal our wounds – it sets us free from what weighs us down inside.

When we change our hearts and forgive, we change ourselves and change our world for the better. This is how we translate the life and message of Jesus into our lives. Jesus asks us to be courageous and to break down the walls that hinder us to forgive ourselves and others. Then will grow close to the one true source of forgiveness – our Saviour Jesus Christ.
