
# Sunday 14th April

#### **Distribution of Communion**

Thank you for giving time and attention to the proposed changes in distribution of communion. This started well last week, and we will be continuing as outlined below. We intend to introduce two chalices along the rail as well as the third chalice for those of you who want to have a dipped wafer. If you are receiving a dipped wafer, or having just a wafer, please go to the left hand side and indicate what you would prefer.

As you may be aware or not, over the last few weeks, we have begun to encourage, as asked by Bishop Jonathan, to move back to receiving communion in two separate kinds which is our normal Church of England practice. Many of you have been and are happy to make this move, but we are also conscious that for others this is still a big change and in this regard we need some time to hear what everyone thinks and feels.


Our proposal over April is begin to make more provision to receive in separate kinds, the bread/wafer and the wine, but also to intinct/dip for those of you who are not ready or able to make the change. In practical terms this means we will distribute communion along the rail from your right to left, first with wafer/bread and then the wine and for those of you would like your wafer dipped or just to receive a wafer, please come to the left-hand end of the rail.

Regarding the wafer being dipped by you, this is not ideal as placing a wafer into your hand and then being dipped by you increases the risk of infection.

In summary, we hope this clarifies things and is helpful and hope you will let us know what you think and feel in the coming weeks.
