In our Gospel reading people are
following Jesus after the miracle of His
feeding the crowd. They come
searching, wanting more, questioning,
wondering what happens now.

In many ways these days are the same –
with so much uncertainty in the world, so
many questions and wondering what
the future holds, looking to Jesus for
leadership, for certainty, for hope.

Jesus meets the crowd's searching with
a simple few words. To look to Him, the
One sent by the Father, and believe.
