

Young adults from many different backgrounds and denominations travel to Taizé for a unique Christian experience of openness, solidarity and encounter. Bishop Graham said: "A pilgrim is someone who leaves the comfort of home to travel beyond familiar boundaries, to cross into new landscapes and places, and to step out into the unknown on an adventure with God. That's my invitation to you to experience something new in your journey with Jesus in the rhythm of prayer and a simple life at Taizé."

For 2025, the prices are as follows:

- Students and those out of work £165.00
- Church workers £275.00
- Those in full-time employment £330.00

Bursaries available for those who need additional support

Being at Taizé is an experience rather than a 'talk'. This means it is accessible to those who do not think of themselves as being religious, as well as those of other faiths. Each day in the community includes services, biblical reflections, small international discussion groups, practical activities, and prayer with the whole community. As well as this, it offers a safe way for young people to experience a wide range of languages and cultures.

Public Witness

Matthias the Apostle (?-c.80)

'Matthias was a disciple of Jesus through the entirety of the Lord's earthly ministry, from the time of Jesus' baptism in the Jordan river. He served Jesus through the Lord's teachings and miracles, the selection of the first twelve Apostles, the crucifixion of Christ, the resurrection and ascension. All the while, Matthias operated in the background, never mentioned by name by any of the Gospels. The book of Acts records that after Jesus' ascension, the Apostles were inspired by Psalm 106 ("Let another take his office") to seek a replacement for the deceased false Apostle, Judas Iscariot. The Apostle Peter recommended that two disciples be nominated who had served Jesus from the beginning. Matthias was nominated, along with a fellow disciple, Barsabbas. After praying and casting lots, Matthias was chosen as the successor to the office of the 12th Apostle. Nothing more is recorded about Matthias in Scripture. Ancient church traditions say that Matthias traveled widely, spreading the good news of Jesus in far off places like Ethiopia and the Caspian sea region. Another tradition says that he was stoned in Jerusalem and beheaded. For this reason, he is often depicted in art victoriously holding the ax that severed his head and reunited him with his Savior. Until 1970, Matthias' feast day was observed in Western Christianity on February 24. Today, he is also commemorated on May 14 to better align with Ascension, Pentecost and other liturgical observances associated with Acts chapter 1.'
