Churchyard of St Andrew's & the Benefice Eco Church Initiative

Lyn Smith, chair of the Parish Council, and two residents of the parish attended the PCC AGM to discuss the management of the churchyard. A consultation plan had been produced to facilitate the discussions. The vicar summarised the conclusions of the discussions by noting that the PCC would take forward the consultation plan along with the comments received during the meeting and would communicate with parishioners via Focus and displaying an information board in the churchyard. The vicar and chair of the Parish Council will disseminate the outcome of the discussion. Lyn Smith said there was a great local sense of ownership of the churchyard. Jeanne Bianco said she would work with Shirley Hockney and Ann Press to share ideas and simplify the management plan.

Safeguarding – Concerns of the Parochial Church Councils

The PCCs of the four churches in the Benefice – Ingleby Greenhow, Kirkby-in-Cleveland, Kildale and Chop Gate – have become increasingly concerned about the serious lapses in safeguarding at the national level of the Church, which led to the recent resignations of the Archbishop of Canterbury and the Bishop of Liverpool. They feel that, whilst safeguarding procedures continue to be successfully implemented at Parish level, they have been seriously let down by the leadership of the Church of England and, as a result, have lost confidence in both the hierarchy of the Church and in the management of the safeguarding system.

The Benefice asked for this to be discussed at a recent meeting of the Deanery Synod. Following an animated debate, which resulted in significant support for the concerns of the Benefice, it was agreed these would be put forward for discussion at the July meeting of the Diocesan Synod.

The PCCs are aware of a number of critical comments by local parishioners about the Church leadership on this matter, and they share their concerns about the impact of adverse publicity on the Church. However, they would like to reassure everyone that there are no safeguarding issues at any of the four Churches and they continue to provide a safe, warm, and welcoming environment for all children and adults.

It marks the start of a new phase development for the school, with a new vision launching soon and a strong cohort of younger pupils starting in Nursery and Reception.
