The Parochial Church Council of St Thomas and St John adopted recently statements required by the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR). This sets out the rights we all have to having personal data about us handled only as we agree. It may be seen on our church website, details below, and pinned to the porch noticeboard.

Many members of the congregation have recently returned Consent Forms. Quite a few forms give a mobile telephone number, state that it may not be publicised, but also consent to be contacted by text message. A person sending out text messages on behalf of the Church, where that is agreed, clearly needs to know the mobile numbers to use. Unless you let us know to the contrary, it will be assumed that you do not object to being listed in a directory for use within the Church – **not** publicised more widely eg on the website. Much the same is true, in a smaller number of cases, for email addresses. 
