#### John 16:12-15

Jesus is speaking to his disciples.......

<sup>12</sup> "I have much more to say to you, more than you can now bear. <sup>13</sup> But when he, the Spirit of truth, comes, he will guide you into all the truth. He will not speak on his own; he will speak only what he hears, and he will tell you what is yet to come. <sup>14</sup> He will glorify me because it is from me that he will receive what he will make known to you. <sup>15</sup> All that belongs to the Father is mine. That is why I said the Spirit will receive from me what he will make known to you."

It is worth reading this passage two or three times – slowly – as it packs a lot in. Jesus had already been giving his disciples a lot of instructions, and now he recognises they are overwhelmed by it all. It can be like that for all of us when we start a new job, or anything new. We need someone to remind us, to prompt us, and to encourage us as we go along. Jesus is effectively telling them not to worry because he isn't leaving them on their own. Enter the Holy Spirit – the third 'person' in the Holy Trinity. Jesus has given an explanation of how the three 'persons' in the Holy Trinity are linked together as one.

First of all notice this - <u>all that belongs to the Father belongs to Jesus</u> - then notice this - <u>The Spirit of truth receives from Jesus what is to be made known.</u> So although the Holy Trinity is a difficult concept for the human mind to fully understand, we know that the three are one.

Did you know - Trinity Sunday is a 'Principal Feast' in the Church of England but it is the only one that celebrates a doctrine rather than a church event?

Almighty and everlasting God,
you have given us your servants grace,
by the confession of a true faith,
to acknowledge the glory of the eternal Trinity
and in the power of the divine majesty to worship the Unity:
keep us steadfast in this faith,
that we may evermore be defended from all adversities;
through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord,
who is alive and reigns with you,
in the unity of the Holy Spirit,
one God, now and for ever.

Amen.

### Fathers' Day

Unlike Mothering Sunday Fathers' Day does not have a long church history. It probably started in the USA just over a century ago and came here with the American troops in WW2. However, it provides a good opportunity to remember that **God is our Heavenly Father**, as well as giving thanks for those men who have been Father figures to us.

#### Patronal Feast



Next Sunday we celebrate our patron saint, St John the Baptist. Historically the patronal service was followed by a feast. So we will be hosting a Post Patronal Picnic Party in the garden at Vicarage Farmhouse to which all church friends and family are invited. Everybody can bring a picnic, but we will also provide food and drinks. St. John is particularly venerated in Italy, so we try to acknowledge this by adding something typically Italian to the menu. This year we will be serving arrosticini, a traditional dish from Abbruzzo, skewered lamb prepared on a furnacella, a special barbecue in the past made from a gutter. We will also serve a vegetarian chilli, smash burgers, rice and accompaniments.

Our church service begins at 10:30 to which all are welcome although you are not obliged to come. We will start the picnic at 13:00 with food served from 13:30. In the event of inclement weather we have 25 square metres of undercover gazebo space that we can all huddle together under. Please RSVP so nobody goes hungry.
