Gather, Grow, Go - What's it all about? - by David Baldwin

You may have noticed the new posters on the pillars in church saying "Gather, Grow, Go"and wondered why they are there and what they mean.

Some time ago the PCC had a vision setting day and one of the subjects discussed was the creation of a "Mission Statement" for Saint Martin's. A mission statement is a formal, short, written statement describing the purpose of an organisation or company. It may be used to guide the actions of the organisation, spell out its overall goals, provide a sense of direction, and guide decision-making. It does not define how to achieve those goals but provides a context within which the organisation may grow and move forward.

The mission statement agreed by the PCC was in three parts:

- To gather as a family, worshiping God and supporting each other.
- To grow in faith and encourage new believers into the life of God's church.
- To go out into the wider community as God's servants, sharing the love of Christ through words and actions.

And this was abbreviated to the phrase: "Gather, Grow, Go"

What does this mean for Saint Martin's? There are many ways in which the mission statement may be viewed and used; below are some thoughts and reflections. You will notice that in this article, and also in the banners displayed in church there are traffic light colours, one for each key word

Gather – This is in red for stop. It is important that when we come to worship that we stop and put aside the worries and pressures of our daily lives so that we can focus on worshipping God without distraction. A challenge is in the word "family"; are we really coming together as a family, loving and supporting each other, or just as a group of individuals whose only link is that we happen to be in church at the same time?

Grow – This is in amber, for being prepared or getting ready (to stop or start). Are we growing as Christians ever closer to God, through our prayers and bible study? Are we as a church enabling and encouraging each other to grow in faith, are we open and welcoming to newcomers or are we "comfortable" where we are and resistant to changes?

Go – Green for (what else but) go or, from the film world, "action!" For most people one of the most challenging aspects of Christianity is that of outreach, whether it is at an individual 1-on-1 level or as a group activity. It often involves sharing part of our self with another person, who may be virtually a stranger, something that the "reserved" British are not very good at!

In June we ask you to pray for everyone living or working in Hillingdon Road, Holly Gardens, Inglewood Road, Midfield Avenue, Midfield Parade, Oakwood Drive, Stephen Road and Westfield Road. We also ask you to remember the following in your prayers and keep them in your thoughts: Andrew, Angela, Charlotte, David, Elizabeth, Joan, John, Joyce, Keith, Lucy, Mary, Mike, Neil, Rob, and all who are suffering in body, mind and spirit.

COLLECT FOR JUNE

Holy God, faithful and unchanging: Enlarge our minds with the knowledge of your truth and draw us more deeply into the mystery of your love, that we may truly worship you, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, One God, now and forever. Amen
