The summer has arrived, our schools, Lighthouse and Y139 have broken up for the summer; for many this is a time associate with holidays or rest. Yet we often just try to squeeze in all things that are still on the to do list. Rest often feels like an elusive luxury or a guilty pleasure. The reality is the busyness and noise of life never stops, notifications ping, responsibilities stack, and sleep becomes a checkbox rather than a sanctuary. But amidst all this chaos, an ancient invitation whispers through time:

"Come to me, all who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest."

This passage from Matthew 11:28 isn't simply poetic comfort. It's a radical redefinition of rest. Unlike the fleeting relief of holidays or naps, this rest reaches deeper into the spirit, into the soul. It's the kind of calm that settles not just the body, but the heart. Jesus offers a haven from exhaustion, not by removing the weight of life, but by walking beside us through it.

Rest, in this light, isn't passive. It's relational. It's a conscious return to a rhythm rooted in grace rather than performance. That means letting go of trying to earn love, prove worth, or fix everything ourselves. Rest says, "You're already held. You're already enough."

And while the world urges us to do more, this spiritual rest beckons us to pause—to breathe, to be. It's not found in a clean house or an empty diary, but in surrender.

So what if rest isn't something we take, but something we're given? What if, instead of fighting for peace, we simply receive it?

Maybe it starts today—with a deep breath, a moment of quiet, and a silent yes to the invitation still echoing through eternity. Because in a world that constantly asks for more, grace offers something better: rest.

May you be blessed with moments of peace, grace and rest this summer.
