Welcome Kajsa!

We warmly welcome our new curate, Kajsa, and her family. We look forward to getting to know them. We've asked her some questions so that we can learn a little about her:

Tell us a bit about yourself

My name is Kajsa (pronounced Kaiser without the 'r'), and I'm married to Matthieu, and mother to Alice (8), Edwin (5) and Clover (cat). Before starting training for ministry, we lived in Leighton Buzzard in Bedfordshire, and I was Operations Manager for the UK Energy Research Centre. I am a former academic who thought that theology was going to be easy - Ha! But it is very interesting, and I find that sensing God's calling is one of the best things that has ever happened to me.

What hobbies do you have?

I love kayaking, mountain biking, running, skiing, hiking, adrenaline kicks, reading books and painting. I write icons, and I do hope to share some of them with you.



Where is your favourite place to visit? Or your favourite place that you have been? And why?

I don't know if I actually have a favourite place, but my family has a cottage in Lapland (Finland) that is very special to me. We scattered my mother's ashes there two years ago, and the place is full of childhood memories and nature is all around. It lies within Sapmi - home to the indigenous Sami population of Northern Europe.

If you could choose to visit anywhere, that you haven't been before, where would it be and why?

I would go to the Holy Land - though perhaps not right now! My friend Joel is being ordained in the Diocese of Jerusalem next year, so I hope to go then. It would be really interesting to see the places mentioned in the Bible!

What are you most looking forward to about starting your curacy?

Experience and being there for you all! I can't wait to see what exactly God is calling me to, and you have been so welcoming and lovely that I'm loving His plan so far.

What gift or skill are you most excited about bringing into your ministry?

My creativity, inclusion-focus, and big heart.

What is your favourite hymn and why?

In Christ Alone was on repeat early on in my faith journey, and I know it by heart - but I can't sing, so please manage your expectations accordingly! I'm also very fond of *Beautiful Saviour* (often sung at funerals in Sweden), *Great is thy Faithfulness* (so beautiful!) and *Servant King* (catchy tune) - oh and the Peruvian Gloria! And there's so many more that I can't really say that I have one favourite.

Church clock: You may have noticed that our tower clock has not been working for the last few weeks. Although it is regularly serviced, some parts are beginning to wear out (it has been operating since 1897!). Repairs are taking place, and we hope to see it operating again shortly.

Records of burials in our

churchyard: We have undertaken extensive work to update the records of burials in our churchyard. As part of this, we aimed to have the records in a format that can be accessed by the general public. We're pleased to report that these records are now available via our web site here. We hope that this will be a great help to local historians and people researching their family history.



Parking in the church car park during the week: If you attend events in the church or church hall during the week, you may have found that the entrance to the church car park is blocked with cones, especially in the early morning. This is to prevent people parking who are not visiting the church or church hall. If you are arriving for an event in the church or church hall during the week and find the car park entrance blocked, please feel free to move cones in order to gain access. It is helpful if you replace them after you have parked. If you are unable to move cones yourself, please phone ahead to the parish office to ask for assistance.

Who's Who in the Old Testament?: The third sessions of this course have been postponed. Look out for a new date in the next newsletter.

Archdeacon's Visitation: At the end of April we welcomed the Revd Canon Mike Smith, Area Dean of Reading, and Roger Moore, Associate Lay Chair of the Reading Deanery, to carry out a Visitation on behalf of the Archdeacon. This involved checking our compliance on a wide range of matters (Health and Safety, building maintenance, keeping of registers and property records, insurance, accounts etc) and talking through our plans and challenges. The visitors felt 'very encouraged' by what they saw and heard, and the final report has now been agreed and sent to the Archdeacon. We have some work to do as a result of their comments, and you may see signs of this in the church (for example, some additional health and safety notices). Thank you to everybody who helped to prepare for the Visitation.

Erleigh Cantors Concert on 7 June: Thank you to all who supported this event by buying tickets and drinks, or making donations. It was our biggest audience ever and the net profit was £1,625, split 50:50 between St Peter's Church and Alexander Devine Children's Hospice. In addition, some £300 was raised for the hospice from the sale of Mama Nunn Preserves. Do look out for this event in St Peter's calendar again next year.

Friends of Amani Tanzania (FOAT) - Supporting children with

disabilities in Tanzania. Bridget and Leslie Green, Trustees of FOAT, will be visiting the Diocese of Shinyanga in early July. They would value our prayers and financial support. Donations for general care ministry and/or bicycles to enable the
