Women's Refuge Welcome Bag

There are opportunities in each church to support the Mothers' Union effort to create welcome bags for those fleeing domestic violence. The following unused items are needed: Washbag, Bath soak/milk, Reusable shower cap, Body moisturiser/lotion, Hair shampoo/conditioner, Small bath towel, Face cream/moisturiser, Ladies shave cream, Small hair brush, Nighttime sanitary pads, Travel wash, Antibacterial wipes/gel, Medium underwear, nightwear, T-shirt, Pairs of socks, Items of makeup E.g. mascara/lip gloss. Mindfulness colouring book, Box of coloured pencils, Bar of chocolate, Journal/large notebook, Small foldable shopping bag.

St Philip's Community Centre

The activities which took place at St Philip's before the Covid epidemic were brought to a halt then. The Pre-school was closed around that time, never to reopen. The Annual Reports of our Church since then, and discussion at Annual Meetings, described some of the adverse aspects from those events, amongst which were financial liabilities which outside bodies deemed to fall to Church volunteers. The PCC, which accepted the responsibility for such payments, has worked with the Charity Commission to ensure that full restitution has been made to those Church volunteers [the ex-employees were compensated properly following pre-School closure]. The Centre itself now again has a full programme of activities and can be found on Facebook.


