Experiencing God with all your senses.

I spent the last weekend at the Latitude Festival; camping in the rain, dancing in a field with the great unwashed, reliving my youth with bands I liked and hearing new ones. It was fun, if a little tiring.

I visited the festival pastor's tent (think town pastors, but just for the festival) and was impressed with the care they were offering, as well as the chance to pray for people – glitter blessings for children were popular and they had blessed hundreds of children (whose parents then had to deal with a tent full of glitter!). Please pray that the seeds sown there will draw people to Jesus.

What surprised me initially though was that the main stage had BSL signers for the big acts. I thought that comedy acts being signed was usual now, but bands – not something I had seen before. It seems that for the hearing impaired you still get the festival experience, the crowd watching the band in a big field, the feel of the music as it hits your body, but the signers enable them to know what the words are, making the experience more rounded.

And I wondered if we can be like this with church sometimes. Being there with others, seeing the words on the screen but not fully connecting with God. Needing the extra help to make sure that we are getting the full experience. Perhaps because we do not let ourselves and need to trust God more. Perhaps because we need a guide – Like Philip and the Ethiopian in Acts 8. If this is you, please do chat to me and we can pray together. Sometimes we don't notice what we are missing until someone points it out.

I pray that you, being rooted and established in love, may have power, together with all the Lord's holy people, to grasp how wide and long and high and deep is the love of Christ, and to know this love that surpasses knowledge—that you may be filled to the measure of all the fullness of God. Ephesians 3: 17-19

Martlesham and Brightwell – Parish Giving Scheme

Brightwell PCC has recently joined the Parish Giving Scheme. Martlesham has been a member for a number of years. Instead of giving in cash at one of our churches or setting up a standing order with your bank you can set up a regular payment by direct debit, via the Parish Giving Scheme. This is normally collected at the beginning of each month. Each year PGS will contact you to see if you are happy for your gift to be increased in line with inflation – and you have the choice to review your giving and change it, if you want to. If you are a taxpayer, then the gift aid can be claimed and PGS do this directly from the government.

The advantage for each PCC is the giving and the tax is received regularly each month and without having to complete a Gift Aid tax claim. The same money given but a lot less work for the treasurer. If you would like to join the scheme you can setup a payment by either:


