CLERGY THOUGHTS

WAS THAT A GOLDCREST?

Dear Friends

Perhaps the greatest delight beyond fellowship with God and brothers and sisters at the Celtic morning prayer on Thursdays, is sitting in the Olive Garden and enjoying the sounds and sensations of creation, particularly the delightful and lively sound of bird song, so often crowded out in the busyness of the rest of the day's activities. It is as if it is the voice of creation waking up to a new day. And of a sense of a deep peace the day offers to those who will dwell in it, absorb it and seek to take it into the often busy hours beyond.

In the poem collection 'The peace of wild things' by Wendell Berry there is a poem called 'Standing Ground', which earths me into, and beyond (because of God's enduring presence), that deep sense of peace:

However just and anxious I have been,
I will stop and step back
from the crowd of those who may agree
with what I say and be apart.
There is no earthly promise of life or peace
that's where the roots branch and we've
their patient silent passages in the dark;
uprooted, I have been furious without a name.
I'm not bound for any public place,
but for a ground of my own
where I have planted vines and orchard trees,

and in the heat of the day climbed up into the healing shadow of the woods.

Better than any argument is to rise at dawn and pick dew-wet berries in a cup.

At this moment in history we live in a very unpeaceful world - unsettled, fermenting, and disquieted — which in turn unsettles nations, communities and individuals in so many ways — and often takes us away from these places of peace and quietude we so desperately need as nations and people — O, that we all would start the day by rising 'and pick dew-wet berries in a cup' and find that greater peace which God offers us in the creation of a new day! Especially so that all we can offer into the day, through all we do and say, is sourced from the peace and inspiration born of God's creativity. Then we might look in the troubled world from a different viewpoint and begin to observe it from God's perspective and love, and ultimate peace — and speak and serve accordingly.

Undoubtedly we live in days of ecological crisis, and how we manage it and seek the wisdom to live at peace within it is important. Job directs us to the source of the necessary wisdom:

'Where then does wisdom come from? And where is the place of understanding? It is hidden from the eyes of all living, and concealed from the birds of the air... 'God understands the way to it, and he knows its place. For he looks to the ends of the earth, and sees everything under the heavens. When he gave to the wind its weight, and apportioned out the waters by measure; when he made a decree for the rain, and a way for the thunderbolt; then he saw it and declared it; he established it, and searched it out. And he said to humankind, "Truly, the fear of the Lord, that is wisdom; and to depart from evil is understanding." (from Job 28)

Ah - wisdom is with God - I kind of knew that, but always good to be reminded. There is a great sense that much of humankind has become unearthed, disconnected from the earth, distracted and disabled from truth, denied dignity, worth and hope. And so we are challenged by the Gospel of Christ which seeks to re-connect our humanity with God's provision of his earth and creation, and passionately onward into the fullness his love and peace.

Earlier in Job (14) is a wonderful poetic image of God's power of redemption through creation:

For there is hope for a tree,
if it is cut down, that it will sprout again,
and that its shoots will not cease.
Though its root grows old in the earth,
and its stump dies in the ground,
yet at the scent of water it will bud
and put forth branches like a young plant.

Summertime is often a time for pondering and reading, and re-thinking and deepening our lives in all sorts of way. Our faith is joyfully treasured with scripture to help us be those who work to restore true creational peace to our worlds – Paul to the Colossians writes:

'Christ is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation; 16 for in him all things in heaven and on earth were created, things visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or powers—all things have been created through him and for him. 17 He himself is before all things, and in him all things hold together. 18 He is the head of the body, the church; he is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, so that he might come to have first place in everything. 19 For in him all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell, 20 and through him God was pleased to reconcile to himself all things, whether on earth or in heaven, by making peace through the blood of his cross.'

Read Paul's extraordinary and awesome words again – what might they mean for you, and for us a God's agents of peace here?

Perhaps this summer there might be more opportunities to seek your own 'olive garden' moments and places, 'a ground of your own' with its 'healing shadow' and 'dew-wet berries' and seek that deeper knowing of God's call on us a peacemakers to people and the earth. And take time and place to dwell with the source of all wisdom - before a tuneful distraction causes us to tap on a phone-screen and, with the amazing apps of today, answer the call 'Was that a gold crest'?

MOTHERS UNION – FRESHWATER Shared by Anne Linington

For the past two years it has been my privilege to lead the Mothers Union "Wave of prayer" service at All Saints Church in June. During the service we heard from Lynn Lawrence about the international work of MU as well as the local group which meets on the first Tuesday of the month in the Parish Hall. Readings and prayers were lead by MU members.

The monthly meetings begin with a service in the Rectory chapel, and these will occasionally be a communion service lead by one of the clergy team. Following the service, there is a welcome cup of tea whilst the afternoon's "business" is addressed, and then a speaker is invited to give a talk. All manner of people and topics are covered during the year, Paul Shoulders and Paul Maher being two that come to mind.

I was asked to speak at the July meeting, which was one of our very warm afternoons. Initially I was going to speak on poetry and photography but decided that was too wide a subject. Plan 2 was "My life in words", and I was going to include some letters- sent and received in addition to some poetry; Having used up the allotted time, I found I'd only reached aged seventeen, so I did a major rethink!

I settled on "My life in my own words" with one poem for each decade in which I have lived i.e. 1950's to 2020's. I also added in an additional one at the beginning, called "The Plough" which tied in with the readings used in the service. It acknowledges growing up in an agricultural community in East Devon where the A38 (now the M5), the Great Western Railway and the Grand Western Canal come together. We recalled the free plastic flowers that came with washing powder, the changing West Wight with the closure of its last bank, and the challenge to sometimes "do it scared" in order to overcome our fears. Hopefully my talk covered the ups and downs of life that all of us face yet reminding us of the faithful presence of God throughout.

The Mothers Union have other events during the year, including a cream tea, outing and a lunch. Men are welcome as well as ladies, and despite the title, those who have not had their own children because "mothering" comes in many different forms. Members come from Freshwater, All Saints and St. Agnes, but also Christ Church, Totland, Colwell Baptist and St. James' Yarmouth. I'm sure you would be made very welcome.

"The Mothers' Union movement began in 1876. Mary Sumner, the wife of a rector in Hampshire, set up a group to support mothers of all kinds in bringing up their children. After delivering a speech in 1885 to churchgoing women at the Portsmouth Church Congress, she inspired many of them to go back to their parishes and set up similar groups.

Over time the groups who met as Mothers' Union became embedded in their communities. They forged strong links with local people and the Anglican Church. They worked to support one another and give a voice to disadvantaged women while addressing wider societal issues. Driven by Mary Sumner's passion for the role of women in bringing about a better society, the groups proved very popular.

The movement today is made up of hundreds of individual Mothers' Union charities spread across 83 countries, making up four million members worldwide. Mothers' Union is unique in that members work together to solve challenges in their local communities. By helping to restore and strengthen relationships in families and communities, the movement gives a sense of belonging and purpose".
