ABOUT TODAY'S READINGS

First Reading Ecclesiastes 1:2; 2:21-23
The wise teacher points out the apparent folly of working hard for material possessions which we cannot take with us when we die.

Second Reading Colossians 3:1-5. 9-11.
Paul calls us to refocus our priorities, so that we reflect the living presence of the risen Christ and grow to become more like him.

Gospel *Luke* 12:13-21

Jesus tells a story about a man who focused so much on the material comfort he obtained that he forgot about the really important and eternal matters of the spirit.

Brothers and sisters: If you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth. For you have died, and your life is hidden with

Christ in God. When Christ who is your life appears, then you also will appear with him in glory. Put to death, therefore, what is earthly in you: sexual immorality, impurity, passion, evil desire, and covetousness, which is idolatry. Do not lie to one another, seeing that you have put off the old self with its practices and have put on the new self, which is being renewed in knowledge after the image of its creator. Here there is not Greek and Jew, circumcised and uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, slave, free; but Christ is all, and in all.
