Deanery Synod Update

So far this year the Greater Northampton Deanery Synod, of which St Peter's is a part, has met twice. In February our first speaker was Damon Boughen from the Hope Centre who told us that every night 35-50 people use the night shelter and on a daily basis 65-70 people use Oasis House where they can eat, shower and receive practical support. 600 families a month use the foodbank. They are currently negotiating to move their day services into Holy Sepulchre rooms to give more scope to increase the support available.

Canon Charlie Nobbs then gave a presentation on the 'Year of Prayer' within the diocese during which he commended two prayer courses. These resources were used by members of our St Peter's Life Groups between Lent and Pentecost. We were all encouraged to revitalise our personal prayer life.

The focus for our July meeting was
Northampton as a town in need of revival
and it was suggested that we could, and
indeed should, take lessons from the 'Great
Fire of Northampton' 350 years ago.
Following a fascinating presentation about
the fire and its effect on the local
community, we were left with a number of
conversation points to take back to our
parishes to help us consider the
significance of our parishes, our ministry of
reconciliation and our place in the local
community.


Much food for thought to accompany the tasty refreshments provided for us!

Clare Pearce, Lay Chair of Greater Northampton Deanery Within St Peter's our main concentration within the ministry of Anna Chaplaincy continues to be St John's Care Home. Our Thursday morning Eucharist is now supported by a pianist each week, and we are really grateful for Marion, Christine M, Hilary S, and Ellie who accompany our hymn singing. The team leading the services are myself, Pamela (as our Anna Friend), Clare and Canon Beverley. Hilary H has left our team for the time being while she pursues other pathways within the church. We also now have our monthly Songs of Praise (also supported by a pianist) on a Wednesday afternoon. Everyone is welcome to any service at St John's as we try to incorporate the care home more into the life of our parish.

While Tea @ 2 has its own band of loyal organisers, Pamela and I can usually be found there as part of the Anna team to sit and chat, and we can occasionally offer lifts to those people who struggle to get there. We also drink tea and eat cake!

With Pamela's support, my role as pastoral lead for St Peter's combines with Anna Chaplaincy so that we continue to take communion to those unable to get to church and visit anyone in hospital or at home. I liaise with our lay pastor team and keep them informed of any of their flocks who may need extra input, be that prayer or a friendly phone call.

Getting Married at St Peter's

The Lord asked Moses, "How long will these people refuse to obey my commands and instructions? They must realize that the Sabbath is the Lord's gift to you. That is why he gives you a two-day supply on the sixth day, so there will be enough for two days. On the Sabbath day you must each stay in your place. Do not go out to pick up food on the seventh day."

Exodus 16.28-29

The Hebrew word *shabat* means to pause or to settle, and comes from a verb that means to sit – stop moving around. In the psalms there is sometimes a pause or interlude marked as selah. That pause, a musical bridge without words, allows the singer to slow down. The words that have been sung sink in, and the whole song is more meaningful. The pauses make all the difference. So it is with sabbath. We stop, and take time just to be, not to do, to rest, reflect, and allow God to be our main focus instead of the pressures of everyday activity. The Sabbath is God's gift – take it, treasure it, and rest in it. May this be a restful month for you.

HOW YOU CAN HELP?

Could you plan a bicycle ride or walk between churches? A list of churches open on the day is available from the parish office, church, Rosemary Pestell, or on the website - www.nhct.org.uk Many of the churches welcome you with refreshments and you have the opportunity to explore some of their special heritage features. It is also possible to Ride in a car! This is an alternative option for those who don't feel fit enough to contemplate riding a bike or walking far. It also enables you to venture further afield and view interesting churches which are possibly not always open, and in other Deaneries.

You can also seek sponsorship for sitting in our church for an hour! This is an essential contribution to the success of the day, as we need people in church to welcome riders and striders to St Peter's, offer them refreshments, point out interesting features (such as the Holman Tapestry in the St Crispin Chapel) - and sign their forms to record their visit. There will be a list at the back of the church for you to sign up for a slot. We will need 2 people for each time slot.

There are **sponsorship forms** on which you record your planned route, so that each church visit can be ticked off on the day by those welcoming you into their church. On the back of the form you record who has sponsored you and for how much. You then use this to collect and record the money you have raised. If your sponsors are able to Gift Aid the amount, that adds significantly to the amount. There are also forms entitled **Advice for Participants**, which you are advised to read.
