Vacancy for Foundation Governor at Stone CofE School

After many years of dedicated service to our school, one of our Foundation governors has stepped down from the role. Many, many thanks to Joy Featherston for representing the church so well on our behalf. So that means there is now a vacancy for the role of Foundation governor on the governing board, and we are looking for a suitable candidate to take this on. The term of office is for four years.

The board currently consists of a group of 8 Governors, from a range of backgrounds bringing varied skills and experiences to the role. A Foundation governor works with the board to ensure it effectively carries out its duties as well as ensuring the school preserves and develops its religious character.

The new Foundation governor will be the link governor for Religious Education. They will not be expected to judge the subject or to be an expert, instead they will visit the school and talk with the subject lead to get the insights they need to help the board hold the school to account and drive improvement.

In order to fulfill the Foundation governor role effectively commitment to the following will be essential:

- A desire, commitment and enthusiasm to help our school community achieve more.
- Attendance & participation at meetings Governors attend 2 meetings per term held 5.30pm – 7.30pm on a Tuesday evening. The dates for the entire academic year are shared to aid planning.
- Reading documents and preparing questions for senior leaders in advance and to play an active part in meetings
- Maintaining confidentiality
- Commitment to training Completing online induction training, keeping statutory training up to date and completing optional online courses for developing knowledge
- Getting to know the school, including visiting the school during school hours a minimum of twice a year.

The candidate will be required to sign the Governing Body's code of practice, and to apply for a DBS enhanced disclosure.





³⁸ As Jesus and his disciples were on their way, he came to a village where a woman named Martha opened her home to him. ³⁹ She had a sister called Mary, who sat at the Lord's feet listening to what he said. ⁴⁰ But Martha was distracted by all the preparations that had to be made. She came to him and asked, "Lord, don't you care that my sister has left me to do the work by myself? Tell her to help me!"

⁴¹ "Martha, Martha," the Lord answered, "you are worried and upset about many things, ⁴² but few things are needed—or indeed only one. Mary has chosen what is better, and it will not be taken away from her."

Do we spontaneously take the side of one sister? Martha was following the cultural tradition of showing hospitality with a meal, but Mary gave her full attention to their guest. Jesus was on his way to Jerusalem and He knew what fate awaited him there so he needed a time of quiet with his friends. Mary sensed this, but Martha wanted to be kind to Jesus in her own way, which meant fussing over a meal. Lord, there have been times when I was more in touch with my own habits and emotions than those of the friends who come to me. Please give me antennae like Mary's!
