In our Sunday services this month we are exploring the theme of everyday faith, having the opportunity to hear the everyday faith story of someone from the Bible and the everyday faith story of someone in our church family. I hope you have been as encouraged by the stories shared as I have. It has been wonderful to hear the difference a relationship with Jesus makes to daily life as well as learn a little more about each other and what our lives look like between Monday and Saturday. My thanks to all those who have been involved so far, and to those who will be sharing over the coming weeks.

I wonder if sometimes as Christians we overcomplicate things. When we persuade ourselves that we need to have an answer to all of life's difficult questions it can result in us avoiding sharing our faith or experiences at all. At 4 Churches Forum on Monday we read the story of the blind man who was brought before the Pharisees and asked difficult questions. The simplicity of his answer was striking, he didn't try to answer the things he didn't know or wasn't sure of, he just answered what he knew 'I once was blind but now I see' (John 9:13-25).



We all have a story of how our faith makes a difference to our daily lives. It is a story that belongs to us and is ours to share as we feel able. It may be that there is someone you know who would benefit from hearing a little bit of your story; perhaps because they are facing a similar situation to one that you have, or because they are in need of understanding, reassurance, or even a good laugh! This isn't about forcing our stories on people, but rather, as we have found in our churches since we started this series, it's about encouragement and hope. Afterall, this is as much about everyday faith as it is about holding onto faith everyday.

Encouragement and hope are things that everyone is in need of. And we will never find out the impact our story might have on someone else's life, unless we are brave enough to share it!
