The Heart of Neighborliness: Lessons from Luke 10

The parable of the Good Samaritan, found in Luke 10:25-37, carries a simple lesson in kindness; it offers a reflection on the very essence of neighbourliness.

When asked "Who is my neighbour?", Jesus masterfully shifts the focus from identifying who qualifies for our love to demonstrating what it means to be a good neighbour.

It's a call to active, compassionate engagement, urging us to look beyond societal divisions, personal inconvenience, or preconceived notions, and instead, to respond with mercy to anyone in need.

The Samaritan, an outcast in Jewish society, embodies this radical love, reminding us that true neighbourliness is not defined by a shared identity, but by a heart moved to action, willing to cross boundaries and offer sacrificial care.

It seems that there has been a view that we should not be using the water heater in the kitchen & toilet but it was not clear why. We have inspected and there is no reason not to use the heater which is switched on via the large red switch in the kitchen. The heater works like an electric shower and only heats the water when a hot tap is running and so there is no real wasted energy. If you are using the church and need hot water simply switch the heater on and the water will be hot. Please switch off when not in use.
