

#### Luke 12:32-40

<sup>32</sup> "Do not be afraid, little flock, for your Father has been pleased to give you the kingdom. <sup>33</sup> Sell your possessions and give to the poor. Provide purses for yourselves that will not wear out, a treasure in heaven that will never fail, where no thief comes near and no moth destroys. <sup>34</sup> For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.

#### Watchfulness

<sup>35</sup> "Be dressed ready for service and keep your lamps burning, <sup>36</sup> like servants waiting for their master to return from a wedding banquet, so that when he comes and knocks they can immediately open the door for him. <sup>37</sup> It will be good for those servants whose master finds them watching when he comes. Truly I tell you, he will dress himself to serve, will have them recline at the table and will come and wait on them.

<sup>38</sup> It will be good for those servants whose master finds them ready, even if he comes in the middle of the night or toward daybreak. <sup>39</sup> But understand this: If the owner of the house had known at what hour the thief was coming, he would not have let his house be broken into. <sup>40</sup> You also must be ready, because the Son of Man will come at an hour when you do not expect him."

#### Some more on prayer

Prayer is a two way conversation with the creator of the universe (wow!)

Sometimes it can feel easier to spend our prayer time talking to God rather than listening to what He might be saying to us. He speaks in so many different ways – we just need to learn how to listen.

**Take time** - listening can take time, so set aside a time and place to focus on God.

**Refocus your mind** – sitting in silence and inviting God to speak to you is a good place to start. You could simply say 'speak Lord, your servant is listening'.

**Stop distractions** – it's easy to lose focus when listening in silence. If you get distracted and find yourself thinking about other things write them down and put them to one side. To remain focussed you could reflect on a simple verse such as 'Be still and know that I am God' (Psalm 46:10).

**Recognise God's voice** – God can speak to us in many different ways: our thoughts, feelings, Bible, experiences or even what's around us. If you find your mind wanders to a specific word, Bible passage, or picture – pay attention as God may be speaking!

This traditional and very popular Common Prayer service takes place out of doors, in front of Hartwell Church. The spectacular and romantic mid-18th-century church was built in the 'Gothic' style between 1753 and 1755 to a design by Henry Keene for Sir William Lee. It is situated in the landscaped grounds of Hartwell House, now a luxurious country hotel. Henry Keene designed the church for Sir William Lee. It is octagonal with east and west towers and is thought to echo the chapter house at York Minster.
