READINGS

Hebrews 13: 1-8, 15, 16 Concluding Exhortations

- 13 Keep on loving one another as brothers and sisters.
- ² Do not forget to show hospitality to strangers, for by so doing some people have shown hospitality to angels without knowing it.
- ³ Continue to remember those in prison as if you were together with them in prison, and those who are mistreated as if you yourselves were suffering.
- ⁴ Marriage should be honoured by all, and the marriage bed kept pure, for God will judge the adulterer and all the sexually immoral.
- ⁵ Keep your lives free from the love of money and be content with what you have, because God has said,
- "Never will I leave you; never will I forsake you."
- ⁶ So we say with confidence,
- "The Lord is my helper; I will not be afraid.
 - What can mere mortals do to me?"
- ⁷Remember your leaders, who spoke the word of God to you. Consider the outcome of their way of life and imitate their faith.
- ⁸ Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever.

¹⁵ Through Jesus, therefore, let us continually offer to God a sacrifice of praise—the fruit of lips that openly profess his name. ¹⁶ And do not forget to do good and to share with others, for with such sacrifices God is pleased.

Luke 14: 1, 7-14

Jesus at a Pharisee's House

14 One Sabbath, when Jesus went to eat in the house of a prominent Pharisee, he was being carefully watched.

⁷ When he noticed how the guests picked the places of honour at the table, he told them this parable:

- ⁸ "When someone invites you to a wedding feast, do not take the place of honour, for a person more distinguished than you may have been invited.
- ⁹ If so, the host who invited both of you will come and say to you, 'Give this person your seat.'
 Then, humiliated, you will have to take the least important place.
- ¹⁰ But when you are invited, take the lowest place, so that when your host comes, he will say to you, 'Friend, move up to a better place.' Then you will be honoured in the presence of all the other guests.
- ¹¹ For all those who exalt themselves will be humbled, and those who humble themselves will be exalted."
- ¹² Then Jesus said to his host, "When you give a luncheon or dinner, do not invite your friends, your brothers or sisters, your relatives, or your rich neighbours; if you do, they may invite you back and so you will be repaid.
- ¹³ But when you give a banquet, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind, ¹⁴ and you will be blessed.

Although they cannot repay you, you will be repaid at the resurrection of the righteous."
