# Doesn't time fly?

Right from my earliest childhood memories until I was about 16 years old, in the words of the old Cliff Richard song, "Time dragged by real slow." The time between one Christmas, birthday or summer holiday and the next seemed to be interminable and as a mid-teenager it seemed to me that it would be forever thus!

Then at the age of 16 my GCSEs (or 'O' Levels as they were called back in those days) showed up and my year 11 absolutely flew by, and from that point on, every year seems to have gone faster and faster. Does this feeling of time speeding up ring a bell with anyone else?

In James 4 v 13-15, we read the following: 'Now listen, you who say, "Today or tomorrow we will go to this or that city, spend a year there, carry on business and make money." Why, you do not even know what will happen tomorrow. What is your life? You are a mist that appears for a little while and then vanishes. Instead, you ought to say, "If it is the Lord's will, we will live and do this or that.

This passage seems to me to be saying that no matter how fast or slow our lives seem to go, we need to remember that whatever we do or achieve will be in the context of God's timing and purposes. We don't know due to our finite human knowledge what the next 24 hours will bring our way much less than next year, however, we can have confidence in God's timings, purposes and plans.

As I write this article, I am looking forward to Harvest, Remembrance Sunday and Christmas and they all look so far away, yet soon all three of these events will be upon us. When it feels as if time flies, even though we all have the same 24 hours in a day and 7 days in a week, let us acknowledge that no matter what comes our way, we need to be trusting in God's timing and not our own whether our lives seem to move at a crawl or a gallop.


