Dear Everyone,

I hope you had an enjoyable August Bank Holiday Weekend.

Phil and I went to Greenbelt, a festival in Northamptonshire we attend annually. The strapline for Greenbelt is Artistry, Activism, Belief. It began in the 70s as a Christian rock festival in a field in Suffolk. It has moved to various different locations over the years and is currently held in the grounds of Boughton House, which becomes a huge campsite for a few days. It is a fantastic event which offers the opportunity to think and be challenged, to worship, sing, pray, listen to talks, poetry, watch theatre, engage in art activities and so much more, a highlight of which is always the Sunday morning communion service.

Over the course of the three days, I worshipped in a variety of different styles, listened to talks including one by the Right Revd Rose Hudson Wilkin, another by Liz Carr from Silent Witness on why she feels that assisted suicide is a bad idea and I heard the thoughts of two politicians. I listened to poetry by Harry Baker, songs by Martyn Joseph, joined in with Beer and Hymns, joined a scratch choir, made a felt coaster and wrote a letter to our MP to ask that Palestinian children stop being imprisoned.

But, for me, the thing that will stay with me for a very long time was a very moving talk by a man called Muhanad Al Quaisy, a YMCA worker from Palestine, who spoke about the reality of living under military occupation in Bethlehem with night raids, child detentions, demolished homes and restricted access to basis services. It was his talk that motivated me to write the letter to our MP through the charity Embrace the Middle East.

Greenbelt is open to all. It is a great festival and if you have never been, why not give it a try next year.

As you all know, Phil and I will be moving on very soon. Please note that during the vacancy, if you have any prayer or pastoral needs, please do let one of the churchwardens know, whose details are on the back of this notice sheet and they will put you in contact with our pastoral team or let Lynda the Parish Administrator know so that she can add your name to the prayer list.

I look forward to seeing some of you at the weekend.


