If you would like to meet Jesus, all you need to do is talk to him. That is all that prayer is. Here is a prayer you can use right now if you want to:

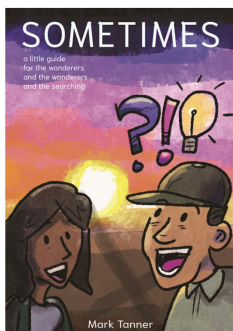
Dear Jesus,

I'm hungry and really want to come to you.

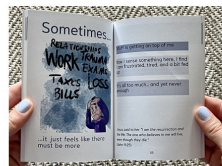

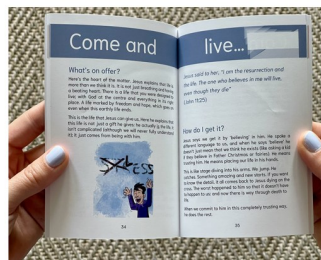

All Saints Congleton have signed up with the 24 - 7 network to host:

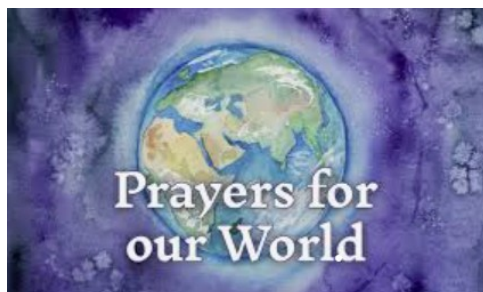

The world needs our prayers, the UK needs our prayer and Congleton needs our prayers, so let us encourage one another to come together to pray.



Praying with Prayers of the Bible - Learning to Pray by Example

Luke 11:1: 'Lord, teach us to pray.'

Luke tells us that the disciples asked Jesus to teach them how to pray after He had just prayed. This is very important. In His preaching Jesus had spoken about prayer; (e.g. Matt. 6:5-8) He had also included prayer in His teaching; e.g. Luke 18:1. But it was neither His preaching or teaching on prayer that inspired this request from His disciples; it was His *example* in prayer. Also, Jesus had sent His disciples out to preach, yet their request was not, 'Lord, teach us to preach.' They had witnessed the mighty miracles that He performed and saw the astonishment of the crowds (Luke 9:43), but they did not ask Him, 'Lord, teach us to perform miracles.' No, they asked instead, 'Lord, teach us to pray.'

The disciples were beginning to learn that there was a direct link between the prayer life of Jesus and His Spirit-anointed ministry. We need go no further than what we find here in Luke's Gospel to see the consistent prayer life of Jesus. As news of His mighty ministry spread far and wide, 'great multitudes gathered to hear

and be healed' (Lk. 5:15). This was 'high noon' in the ministry of our Lord and as the crowds gathered to hear Him, 'He withdrew to the wilderness and prayed' (v.16).

The next chapter tells us that Jesus made a habit of having whole nights of prayer. 'In those days He went out into the hills to pray, and He continued all night' (6:12). A little later the evangelist records that immediately following the feeding of the five thousand, the disciples were with Jesus – and He was praying (9:18). When Luke recounts the Transfiguration of Jesus, he says the Lord took Peter, John and James up the mountain 'to pray' (9:28).

Luke wants his readers to know about the prayer life of Jesus. At every step of His ministry we see Jesus praying. He prayed early in the morning before the day began; He prayed late in the evening after hours of demanding ministry; He prayed in secret; He prayed with His disciples, and He often prayed all night. He prayed in homes; He prayed by the roadside; He prayed on mountains; He prayed in boats; He prayed in the wilderness; He prayed in the synagogue; He prayed in the Garden of Gethsemane; He prayed on the Cross.

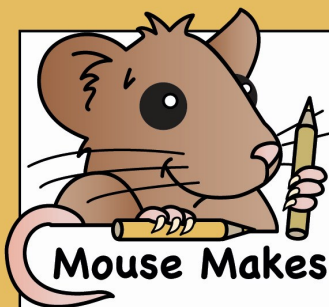

Recycling & Green Living Tips

10 Ways to inspire reuse in your community

Reduce, reuse, recycle. years, we've heard



that environmental mantra. We often follow it. Companies cut down on their packaging, so it costs less to ship, and we recycle our plastic bottles and cans. But what about reuse?

How many of us put something to further use beyond its initial application? Reusing can be much better than recycling. A perfectly good item can have its lifespan extended, even if it has served its purpose in your own home. It can go to someone else, for whom it is good as almost new, and in the process, we save the cost of producing brand-new goods that will also have limited lives. Don't know how to get your old goods into the hands of others? Here are some ideas.

1. Freecycle is easy to use. It is a great website that lets users (both individuals and businesses) post items they no longer need. The first person to respond to a message gets

to pick up the item and keep it — for free. It is a good way of getting rid of things you have too many of. I have got rid of lots of plant pots to people who were looking for them.

2. Start a magazine or book trade

Don't let them pile up around the house or recycle them after just one read, trade magazines with your neighbours. Each magazine gets read more than once, and we all save on buying more magazines than we need. (Don't worry, you're not cutting the magazines publishers out of any revenue by doing this.

Magazines assume that their issues are going to be passed around, and they set their ad rates based on that higher number of eyeballs, not on subscriptions or newsstand sales). Another option is to leave your unwanted magazines and books in a local Little Free Library — or start one of your own for your neighbourhood. It's as easy as putting up a postbox. Some places have used old phone boxes to start one.

3. Be thrifty

Most towns have charity shops in our town. Whenever you have something you no longer need, be it clothes or recently replaced computer monitor — take it over to one of the charity shops. The charities they serve get money when they sell the items, and someone else in the area gets a great

bargain. And if you buy something at the charity shop, share the news with your friends. Or, heck, bring them along when you go shopping. Maybe they'll find a great bargain there, too. Some do not take electrical or electronic goods and others do so check in advance before taking any of those.

4. Get schooled

Most schools are happy for supplies, whether it's office goods or things they can use for craft projects. Check with your local schools. Sometimes it helps when parents pool their efforts to meet a need. So, if there's a newsletter for your kids' school, sign up. If there isn't, start one.

5. Work with local groups

Use your church or other local organisation to start a reuse project. Maybe you can have collection boxes for winter coats at your church or a pot exchange at your garden club. This also works for certain businesses with a social element e.g. cafes with book swap boxes where customers can take or drop off books for free.

6. Hold a Reuse Fair

Have an event with a few tables where people can bring good items and others and take them home to use. It can be clothing or other items.

7. Be a Reuse Model

Peer pressure, when used correctly, can be a powerful tool. Stand up as

an example of ways that things can be reused. Bring reusable cloth bags with you when you shop. Leave your old magazines in doctors' surgeries (cut your address off, for your privacy). Start craft projects that reuse unwanted items (like old CDs and DVDs)

8. Return your clothes hangers to M&S

Marks & Spencer's will take back any of their own brand plastic hangers in their stores to reuse or if that is not possible, to recycle. Perhaps other stores will also do so ask when you are purchasing an item that comes with a hanger.

9. Save the moss

Moss absorbs more CO2 than trees, grows without soil and helps cool towns and cities so stop removing it in your gardens and let it grow.

10. Avoid plastic in hair washing

Shampoo bars and conditioner bars were introduced by Lush many years ago but many other brands are now available in most supermarkets, Boots, Bodyshop and others plus on-line. Most are packaged in paper or cardboard and will last for 60-80 washes which replaces 2-3 bottles of regular shampoo which are usually plastic. They are also useful for travel.
