

Opening Hymn: Rejoice the Lord is King Number 563 in Common Praise

Collect

Almighty and everlasting God, who gave to your apostle Bartholomew grace truly to believe and to preach your word: grant that your Church may love that word which he believed and may faithfully preach and receive the same; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

First Reading: 1 Corinthians 4:9-15

⁹ For I think that God has exhibited us apostles as last of all, as though sentenced to death, because we have become a spectacle to the world, to angels and to mortals. ¹⁰ We are fools for the sake of Christ, but you are wise in Christ. We are weak, but you are strong. You are held in honour, but we in disrepute. ¹¹ To the present hour we are hungry and thirsty, we are poorly clothed and beaten and homeless, ¹² and we grow weary from the work of our own hands. When reviled, we bless; when persecuted, we endure; ¹³ when slandered, we speak kindly. We have become like the rubbish of the world, the dregs of all things, to this very day.

¹⁴ I am not writing this to make you ashamed, but to admonish you as my beloved children. ¹⁵ For though you might have ten thousand guardians in Christ, you do not have many fathers. Indeed, in Christ Jesus I became your father through the gospel.

²⁴ A dispute also arose among them as to which one of them was to be regarded as the greatest. ²⁵ But he said to them, 'The kings of the Gentiles lord it over them; and those in authority over them are called benefactors. ²⁶ But not so with you; rather the greatest among you must become like the youngest, and the leader like one who serves. ²⁷ For who is greater, the one who is at the table or the one who serves? Is it not the one at the table? But I am among you as one who serves.

²⁸ 'You are those who have stood by me in my trials; ²⁹ and I confer on you, just as my Father has conferred on me, a kingdom, ³⁰ so that you may eat and drink at my table in my kingdom, and you will sit on thrones judging the twelve tribes of Israel.

PCC TREASURER NEEDED – URGENT

We urgently need someone to take on the role of Treasurer. This is an important role in the life of the church. You do not need to be an expert in finances, just a willingness to learn and compute literacy. Terry Daniels, our interim treasurer will work with you to ensure a handover and you will have the support of the Wardens and PCC. As a PCC member you will need to complete some Safeguarding modules and have an enhanced DBS. Please speak to Jenni or Terry if you think you may be able to take on this role.

VOLUNTEER NEEDED: PARISH SAFEGUARDING COORDINATOR (PSC)

After over a decade in this role Anne Harris intends to step down at the next APCM. We are seeking to recruit in time for a smooth handover from Anne and for the next PSC to work alongside Mike Baynham as part of a team.

This role is; to work with the incumbent and PCC in promoting safeguarding within the parish, and to ensure that church leaders are implementing the Church of England's safeguarding guidance. The Parish Safeguarding Coordinator is the key link person between the parish and the Diocesan Safeguarding Team.

This role requires an enhanced DBS and completion of several training modules offered by the Diocese. Good computer literacy is essential for this as it includes working with a database.

If you think this might be something you would be interested in and God is calling you to consider it, please speak to Anne Harris or Jenni

Crewes. We can offer you a more detailed role description. Please pray for the right person to be recruited for this essential aspect of parish life.

HOLY COMMUNION SERVER(S) NEEDED

We are seeking a new member (or perhaps members!) to join our team of Holy Communion servers. This role includes assisting with the preparation of the altar, helping with the distribution of Holy Communion and clearing at the end of the service. Due to the nature of our building Servers need to be able to use stairs. Full training will be given, including Basic Awareness Safeguarding which is imperative for any volunteer role in the church. PONDERING FAITH

Pondering returns this autumn, an opportunity to learn together over hot drinks and pastries as we consider what it means to follow Jesus. The next two sessions will focus on Confirmation and everyone is invited whether you've preparing for Confirmation or not. Those who have been confirmed are encouraged to come too as we learn together. The dates are 27th September and 25th October both from 10:30am until about 11:45am in the choir vestry.

PCC highlights: 23rd July 2025

PCC met on 23rd July and began by hearing from the ECO group reps.
- James' has produced an ECO policy, to be read and discussed at next PCC meeting. We are making good progress towards the Silver award. The national butterfly count will take placed in a couple

of weeks' time after Sunday service. People are donating to the recycling box in the porch and the box is being emptied regularly. There will be a notice in the pewsheet again to remind everyone they can bring old phones, cameras, stamps, etc., to be donated.

Safeguarding – new members are completing their training asap and new posters will soon be printed and displayed. PCC approved 2 non-church activities – Karate club and Rugby Tots – in the hall.

Safeguarding officer confirmed that safeguarding videos are being updated and Diocese have advised that we should not use the old training videos.

Treasurer is still trying to access HMRC gift aid site. The Three Shires Festival was successful, bringing in £800 for the Church. Legacies - Douggie's legacy requires us to look at alternative sources of power (solar panels) and a solar panel group has been set up to look at possible grants to add to the legacy. Treasurer has also been notified of a £10,000 legacy from M. Scrivenger (Peter Stokes remembers a Mr Scrivenger being church warden many years ago). Treasurer checking if there are any restrictions attached to the legacy. Tree maintenance - some tree maintenance took place 2 years ago and some of those need pruning again, along with some that were not cut back previously, particularly those now overhanging in the car park. Julie to obtain quotes. For tree maintenance, the Diocese will cover half the cost if we use one of their recommended tree maintenance companies.

Scout hut – after a recent inspection, it was recommended that an Asbestos Management Survey be obtained before any decision is made on its future use. A 'Hut' group was set up and will review the survey and report back.

Inclusive church – hearing difficulty - although we have the hearing loop facility in church, it can still be helpful to see the face of the person reading or leading prayers, etc. Jenni to take to Worship Planning Group.

Health and Safety – suggestion that we use a table in the children's corner to provide biscuits and squash for children after Sunday

morning service has finished, rather than them having to join the queue in the inner porch where it can be quite congested. Julie will speak to Refreshments Lead asap. There was a suggestion that we put together a salting/sanding group to help clear Church driveway of snow in the winter — volunteers welcome!

AOB - Ian and Elizabeth are producing a 'Welcome' book. Ian confirmed that the Icon consultation period finished last Friday and the Icon will be going up in Church shortly. Peter Stokes has produced 3 booklets (Church, Choir and rambles) using photos and information from the original St. Hilda's website. Booklets will be available shortly with a request for donations rather than a set price.

RECYCLING

Due to the RNIB introducing postage costs which the church would have to cover, the Eco Group has decided to stop collecting stamps and currency for RNIB. However, these items can still be placed in the Recycling for Good Causes box in the porch. We will still send off the stamps that were placed in the RNIB boxes.

We can accept:

- Stamps UK and overseas, any age. Please leave 1cm around stamps when cutting them off envelopes.
- Coins & Currency any currency, any age
- Jewellery unwanted gold, silver, damaged items, costume jewellery, watches
- Tech mobile phones, cameras (film, digital, or video), Sat Navs, games consoles (including games and accessories), MP3 players, iPods, and tablet computers.

Thank you for all your donations so far which will raise funds for the church.

Please note: some electrical items donated recently cannot be accepted and these have been taken to the small appliances collection point at the tip. Please check the list above (also listed on the box) before donating, or speak to the Eco Group if you're not

sure. For advice on where to take other electrical goods, the Recycle Now website is very useful: www.recyclenow.com
Finally, we kindly ask that you do not bring your household recycling (paper or cardboard) to add to the church recycling bins which are for church use only.
