REFLECTIONS......REV. BEA ERSKINE

The healing of the crippled woman in the gospel reading this week is, as miracles tend to be, jaw dropping and wonderful.

Unable to stand up straight and bent over, this poor woman had suffered with 'a spirit that had crippled her for eighteen years' and then Jesus sets her free from her 'ailment'.

There is much commentary on this passage about the cause of her illness and how to interpret it, but what caught my eye this time was the interpretation by the leaders in the synagogue.

CONTINUED

Furious that Jesus was 'working', healing the sick on the sabbath, he shouts at them to come back and get cured on the other six days of the week! In the Old Testament we hear how God rests from the work of creation to bless the sabbath as a day of rest. In observing the day in this way, they think it is kept holy, but as Jesus says, in doing so, that shouldn't mean they avoid holy work, be this either in complete rest, or one of active sabbath service in the name of God. Denying urgent medical treatment and not providing water for your animals are not acts of holiness. The question for us this week could be, when should we set down our work and what might active holiness mean for us on the sabbath?
