'Perfect' - Rev Peter Davies

'Perfect'. It's not always a good word. Nice, if it's said about oneself. But is it helpful? I have my doubts. Yes, Jayne Torvill and Christopher Dean's twelve 6.0 scores at the Sarajevo 1984 Winter Olympics were the 'perfect' score; but when it comes to matters of faith, trying to be perfect is altogether different because, and apologies for the dreadful wordplay, we begin to skate on very thin ice.

Trying to be perfect leads all to easily to perfectionism, and that is not good. Before moving to Worcester and visiting a bishop to discuss vocation, I said that I had given up striving for perfection. The bishop paused, prayerfully placed his hands together with his fingertips to his chin, looked heavenward and slowly uttered, 'Thank God!'

But, 'Hang on,' you say, 'Doesn't Jesus say in the Sermon on the Mount, "Be perfect,

therefore, as your heavenly Father is perfect."?' Yes, he does! But are we talking about the same thing? Folks, it's an understatement to say that there's a world of difference between our idea of 'perfect' and God's!

St Matthew frames Jesus' words by placing them after the Beatitudes, about us being salt and light, seeking righteous faithfulness, seeking reconciliation, being faithful in marriage, keeping our word, not retaliating ... and ... loving our enemies.

But what about St Paul's idea of being perfect? He observed the Jewish Law to the letter, so he was 'perfect' in the eyes of the Law, yet he regarded that as 'rubbish'. And after St Paul pleaded with God for healing, God said, 'My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness.'

Are we getting there? I think so. Perfection comes only by receiving God's free gift of grace, and the evidence is the outworking of the Holy Spirit in our lives. And what might that look like? Again, St Paul guides us. He tells the Colossian church, 'Above all, clothe yourselves with love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony.'

Remember that love removes fear, and therefore the fear of not being perfect. God loves us as we are. However hard we try, we know that we can't get straight 6.0 scores by our own merits in the sinless stakes. But Jesus, 'the pioneer and perfecter of our faith', has removed any barrier between us and God, and therefore, has already restored our relationship with him.

If you've never made a mistake, you've never done anything! So, Godly perfection is not our elimination of imperfection. The perfection that God calls us to seek is to imitate him in love.

Enough said!
