Response to Sue Birrell from The Parish Council RE: Coned off area by the Pond

"As you will have noticed this part of the pond is not now an attractive feature. Constant parking has eroded the grass so there is just an earth bed in the area. This area has never been allocated for parking so when the Parish Council made the decision to improve the pond area it was decided to put a low fence along the border to the road to prevent parking so no more damage is possible.

The area will then be turfed to provide continuity with the rest of the pond area. The land will be levelled and then the fence installed.

We will have to wait for the cooler wetter weather before laying the turf of it will die in these drought-like conditions.

This exercise will reinstate the pond as an attractive feature of the village. I understand this will inconvenience you and others who have parked there over the years but fortunately the WMRG car park is open all year round and is a short walk away.

For your information, the Chestnut tree at the front of the Church has recently dropped a large branch which fortunately caused no harm.

On examination of the tree, it has been found to be diseased and rotten in the main trunk area.

No remedial action is possible so it has been agreed with Buck Council tree dept that it should be removed.

This will happen next week.

The Parish council will plant another tree as a replacement."

I will circulate this to the residents of Churchway who have also been asking me what was going on. One resident has been parking by the pond in order to release a space for churchgoers and didn't know why it was coned off.
