Additional Services for August

80th Anniversary of VJ Day - Service of Remembrance and Thanksgiving

On May 8th, members of our communities came together to mark the 80th anniversary of VE day, but for so many, the war was not over. For those involved in the conflict in the middle east the waiting was to continue.

On **Friday August 15**th **at 12noon**, we invite our communities to come together once more, as our focus turns to that day 80 years ago; a day which is widely recognized as the day the war ended in the Pacific, while the formal surrender documents were not signed until September 2nd 1945.

+Hugh Nelson, Bishop to the Armed Forces states that :

"The 80th anniversary of VJ Day is a moment of profound significance for our nation. It is a time to remember with deep gratitude the courage and sacrifice of those who fought for the freedoms we enjoy today. In an increasingly dangerous world, I encourage all our churches to participate in these commemorations, to ring their bells, to offer prayers for peace, and to provide spaces for their communities to come together in remembrance. As we honour the past, so we renew our commitment to building a more peaceful and just world for all."

Thoughts from Rev Alison

July has been a busy month for all; you will all know for yourselves how it has impacted you, whether physically, emotionally or spiritually. We as a community have shared joys and sorrows, and have grown closer because of that.

I sit down to share some thoughts after an amazing weekend in my life as a curate here in this very special



place, having yesterday led a wedding blessing service at St Bueno's, Culbone and today sharing in the Lammas service at Stoke Pero.

Lammas, something that hadn't been on my radar before coming here, is a very special occasion as a loaf of bread is brought to the altar, symbolic of the first grains of harvest given in thanksgiving to God and surrounded by God's wonderful creation - what better place to come together to worship. Each year, I learn a little more, for Lammas is also a wonderful time to pause, reflect and give thanks. Finding time to do that in our busy lives can be difficult but so important in so many ways.

I recently had the joy of conducting a wedding where the reading was part of the lovely romantic poetry that is found in the Song of Solomon — and contains many pearls of wisdom and guidelines. I used one to remind the newly weds about the importance of valuing the time they could spend together, it is something that comes in the invitation from Solomon to his beloved as he says, 'Arise, my love, my fair one and come away.'

It is important to spend quality time with the one you love and the one who loves you, which includes having that time with God, to pause, reflect and give thanks.

So as I prepare to lay aside the busyness of work and home life to go on a Retreat to do just that, I want to share with you some useful prompts I found online focusing on ways to do that with the spirit of Lammas in mind.

- What lessons have you learned so far this year?
- In what ways have you grown personally, professionally, or spiritually since the beginning of the year?

Future Intentions


- What are your intentions or goals for the remainder of the year?
