God's Beautiful Creation!

Dear Friends

I was scrolling through the channels, as you do and wondering what to watch when I came across a program titled 'Human.' It's a 5-part programme following early Homosapien's as they step out of Africa and venture into the wider world. It's amazing that they can date a scull going back some three hundred and fifty thousand years ago.

Interestingly, studies show that a substantial percentage of scientists believe in some form of deity or hight power – a research poll found that 33% of scientists believe in God whilst 18% believe in a universal spirit or hight power. Many scientists who believe in God, either as a prime mover or as an active force in the universe, have written eloquently about their beliefs.

Well, whatever they believe, I have to say that seeing the beautiful, glorious African mountain scenery I was reminded of Moses' request to see God's glory when he met with God on Mount Sinai. I quote Exodus 33:18-23, 29-30:

Then Moses said, 'Now show me your glory.' And the Lord said, 'I will cause all my goodness to pass in front of you, and I will proclaim my name, the Lord, in your presence. I will have mercy on whom I will have mercy, and I will have compassion on whom I will have compassion, but, he said, you cannot see my face, for no one may see me and live.' Then the Lord said, 'There is a place near me where you may stand on a rock. When my glory passes by, I will put you in a cleft in the rock and cover you with my hand until I have passed by. then I will remove my hand and you will see my back; but my face must not be seen.'

When Moses came down from Mount Sinai with the two tablets of the covenant law in his hands, he was not aware that his face was radiant because he had spoken with the Lord. When Aaron and all the Israelites saw Moses, his face was radiant, and they were afraid to come near him.

Reflecting on this reading I notice that all God reveals is his back – better translated as 'where I have just been,' or even 'my footprint.'

When I notice a footprint, I'm noticing where someone has left their mark, their imprint. I would love to see where God has left his mark, his footprint although I won't truly see God's full glory this side of eternity. However, when I look around our world, I see the afterglow of his presence, I get a glimpse of glory.

I see him when I look at creation in all its vastness and smallness, and that is what I saw during those times the presenter stood on the mountain top and the camera spanned over the vastness and awesome beauty of the mountains.

Think of one of the most beautiful places you can imagine. Maybe it's a snow-covered forest, maybe it's the beach or a bustling city with a magnificent skyline. Now, imagine you're inside, looking out of a window at that beautiful place. If you're in the forest, maybe you're in a cabin, peering out at the beautiful pine trees, the window is ornate with clear glass that lets you look at every angle of that view. When you lean up against the window, you can see your soft breath on it, but the view is the breathtaking, captivating part of this experience - the view is what you're there for.

This reminds me of the Bible - the Scriptures are like that window; they allow us to see the character, magnificence and the glory of God; they reveal to us the image of Christ. We glimpse the beauty and majesty of God, his whole heart for us, and we're compelled to seek his face; notice, however, that the Scriptures are not in themselves God - the Scriptures illuminate Jesus for us, but they are not Jesus - they are the miraculous window through which we come to know him more truly.

Whatever beautiful views you may see during the holidays, I hope you get some quality rest and refreshment. Go well, and please do pray for each other, for the Church and the wider world, especially pray for the conflict in the middle east and that Christ's peace and unity might prevail and his love for one another might be the mark of us, his people.
