From The Ministry Team

The Revd Terry Wilcock writes:

Want to try something different?

You feel that need inside to stop for a cup of coffee. You have been working so hard that you really must talk to your husband about booking a holiday. You know you cannot ignore those swelling ankles anymore and you have to make a doctor's appointment, even though you hate telephone consultations. Maybe, depending on that inner call, you will push yourself over the line and take some action.

Or maybe it will take someone else, a friend, your husband, your wife, even one of your children to wind you up into moving that inner urge into reality. As soon as I mention the word "vocation" you might be tempted to switch off. I certainly do not mean that everyone reading this should train to be a priest in the Church of England. Perhaps that might not be a wonderful scenario. But you do have a calling – to be a parent, a grandparent, a godparent; or you may be working out your calling in daily life as a farmer, a teacher, a cook – whatever makes you feel good.

I think that I had a calling to ministry early on in life but I kept repressing it. But then it kept popping up but I didn't do anything about it. Just after Ruth and I married we had our first, very small home, in a village near York where we had to walk through our neighbour's garden to reach our back door. Our neighbour was churchwarden at the village church and he soon invited us to attend. We did, and continued to attend churches as my job moved us around the country. But it wasn't until some 25 years later that I started training for the ministry.

A calling has something to do with what you feel God is saying to you, in feelings, in words, in prayer, in many different ways; it is also what other people see in you that may develop into a Christian ministry. There are many ministries which do not lead to ordination. If you want to talk about this, talk to me. Or you could go on a church course, "Your Shape for God's Service", — in which case contact Rev Beverley Lock: beverly.lock@carlislediocese.org.uk

There is of course the parable of the talents. What abilities God has given to you. Some minister in the church, others in the wider world. I think it is about living out our faith with joy, satisfaction and fruitfulness. What is your next step? Think and pray about it over that cup of coffee.

WHY SUPPORT MANNA HOUSE?

Surely there are no homeless people in Kendal? After all this is not the middle of Manchester is it?well there were 19 homeless helped just in July this year at Manna House. Andrea, chief officer, tells us about Ben and asks for our help.

Ouch! The cost of living is pinching hard at Manna House right now. Donations from the incredibly generous public are way down, as is our success rate with grant makers. There is stiff competition for less available funds and Manna House is not alone in feeling the pain.

Many of you will be familiar with Manna House and the critical work we do keeping people off the streets, out of prison and hopeful of a better life. We work with people like Ben who was an emergency referral made by Community Mental Health Team who was referred and assessed on the same day. As a 72-year-old white male arriving from Wigton, Ben was offered no duty by the council because of accommodation planned in Barrow for the following week. Although unmedicated, he had a multiple diagnosis for physical and mental health conditions. Ben was accommodated in the POD for 4 nights while this was arranged. Manna House staff liaised with the mental health team who visited him in the POD to check on his wellbeing and update us on the placement in Barrow. POD accommodation was provided over the weekend, with Manna House staff coming in out of hours to provide both shower and laundry support, as well as a welfare check. This case highlights the POD as a flexible resource, affording both partnership working and the Manna House ability to provide support and compassion at very short notice.

Every year Manna House supports over 500 people to pursue housing security, better health and financial stability. Through no fault of our own, Manna House now finds itself in need of support. Could you help? We know church members are amongst our best and most dedicated supporters, so we hesitate to ask for more. Could you spread the word farther with friends and family or any groups you belong to? Maybe you could take part in a fundraising event for us, or even set up one of your own? If you are in any position to increase your giving, now would be the time to act in favour of Manna House.



We have a jumble Sale in October and a Christmas coffee morning as well as welcoming Becky to our parish in November.



LIFE IN THE 17TH CENTURY, (contd from July/Aug magazine)

Let's just return to the subject of bathing and hygiene. As I said earlier, they took their yearly bath in May, but the bath would have been just a large tub filled with hot water. The man of the house would have the privilege of the first bath in the nice clean water, then all the other sons and workmen, then the women and children, finally the babies of the house. By now you can imagine the water was pretty thick and dirty, - hence the saying, "DON'T THROW THE BABY OUT WITH THE BATH WATER".

I'll describe the house a little. We are all aware that most of the houses had thatched roofs and basically that's all they were. Thick straw, piled high with no wood underneath. They were the only places for the little animals to get warm. So all the pets, dogs, cats, other small animals, mice, rats, bugs, all lived in the roof. When it rained the thatch became so slippery that sometimes the animals would slip and fall off the roof. Thus the saying, 'IT's RAINING CATS AND DOGS.

Since the thatched roofs were somewhat flimsy and not of the obvious standard they are today, there was nothing to stop things from falling into the house. The only thing they could do was to clean up as best they could. But this posed a real problem in the bedroom, where bugs and other droppings could mess up your nice clean bed. So, a canopy was needed, but how could it be held up. Easy! Erect four big posts, one at each corner and hang the sheet over the top. So, that's where those 'BEAUTIFUL BIG FOUR POSTER BEDS WITH CANOPIES' came from.

When you entered a house at this time, you would have noticed that most times the floor was nothing more than dirt. Only the wealthy had something better. So the poor became 'DIRT POOR'. The wealthy would have had slate floors, which in the winter, as we say today 'STONE COLD' often cold enough so that bare skin coming into contact with it would actually 'stick'. In the winter the slate would become rather slippery when wet. The idea came to start spreading thresh (straw) to help the occupants keep their footing. As the winter wore on, extra layers of straw would be added until when the door was opened it would all start slipping outside. To stop this occurring, they placed a piece of wood across the doorway which we now know as 'THRESH HOLD'

At some point, this straw (thresh) obviously had to be cleaned out, so when the cold winter ended, the straw was collected up and thrown away. The start of our annual 'SPRING CLEANING'.

I am on a limited income and trying not to spend too much each month. Council Tax seems a big expense. Is there any way I can pay less?

You might be able to pay less council tax or not pay it at all depending on your circumstances. It's a good idea to contact the council and ask them.

If you're the only adult in your home, you'll get a 25% discount. When working out how many people live in a property, some people aren't counted - they're called 'disregarded people', e.g. student nurses. If everyone in a house is disregarded there is a 50% discount. If everyone is a student or severely mentally impaired, you won't pay any council tax.

If you're entitled to a discount because someone has moved out, you're entitled to the discount from when the person moved out, even if you told the council later.

Next, if you are on a low income or receive benefits, you might be able to get your council tax reduced. The council will ask you details about your income and your circumstances, to work out your entitlement. You may also be eligible for additional support if you've reached State Pension age.

Even if none of the reduction criteria apply to you, the council can still make a 'discretionary reduction'. They'll normally only do this if you can show that you're suffering severe hardship.
