Our bible readings for the 11th Sunday after Trinity 31 August – 8am service

1 Corinthians chapter 15, verses 1 -11

Now, brothers and sisters, I want to remind you of the gospel I preached to you, which you received and on which you have taken your stand. ² By this gospel you are saved, if you hold firmly to the word I preached to you. Otherwise, you have believed in vain.

³ For what I received I passed on to you as of first importance: that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, ⁴ that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures, ⁵ and that he appeared to Cephas [Peter], and then to the Twelve. ⁶ After that, he appeared to more than five hundred of the brothers and sisters at the same time, most of whom are still living, though some have fallen asleep.

⁷ Then he appeared to James, then to all the apostles, ⁸ and last of all he appeared to me also, as to one abnormally born.

⁹ For I am the least of the apostles and do not even deserve to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the church of God. ¹⁰ But by the grace of God I am what I am, and his grace to me was not without effect. No, I worked harder than all of them – yet not I, but the grace of God that was with me. ¹¹ Whether, then, it is I or they, this is what we preach, and this is what you believed.

POPPY WATERFALL

The Knatty Knitters Group are busy knitting and crocheting poppies for a 'waterfall' to be displayed outside St Paul's church at Remembrance. Over 1,000 poppies have so far been knitted but more are needed for a spectacular display.

If you can come along on a Wednesday afternoon to the Parish room between 2pm and 3.30pm we will be very pleased to see you. There is tea and cake. If not, then please enjoy knitting at home.

If you no longer knit but have leftover wool hidden away somewhere, we can make very good use of it. It doesn't have to be red; purple, white or black are all appropriate.

Please see below for a very simple 9 row pattern.

Poppy Pattern 1 Needles size 9 / 3.75mm

Cast on 58 stitches (large poppy)
48 stitches (small poppy)
Rows 1 and 2 Purl
Row 3 K4 K2tog repeat to last 4 stitches, K4

Row 4 Purl
Row 5 K2tog repeat to the end, K1
Row 6 Purl
Row 7 change to black wool Knit row
Row 8 P2tog repeat to end
9 Knit

Run wool through remaining stitches.
Pull tight. Sew up
For black poppies, use white, Pale green or pale yellow for centres.



Poppy Pattern 2. Needles size 8 / 4mm

Cast on 60 stitches
Rows 1-8 K2, P2 across the row
Row 9 Join in black wool Knit across the row
Row 10 P2tog across the row (30 stitches)
Row 11 Slip1, K2tog, psso to end

Break off yearn leaving a long tail and thread through the remaining stitches and pull tight.

Sew up edges


Holy Cross Church will be open from 11am until 4pm.
