# A Reflection on the Gospel this week. (Rev. Jo) "Jesus Heals Crippling Illness". (Lk 13 v 10-17)

This weeks' reading gives an account of the time Jesus healed a woman who had been bent double for 18 years. As I pondered the words, I was struck by the amazing courage of the woman. She was determined to see Jesus and ask Him for help, even though she had to cross the threshold of a place of worship where she would have been thought of as unclean for so long..

Imagine the stares from the Leaders of the Law. Imagine the "tut's" from the synagogue members, (women would have been segregated from the men remember,) but she walked right up to Jesus in faith. Imagine how the room would have gone silent... how dare she bring her crooked body into their midst? And how dare Jesus welcome her?

Of course we don't speak like this now. We know that all are loved from the inside out, but at the time of this account, people saw outward affliction as inward evil... thank goodness we no longer live like this.

As a Priest called to welcome those who have been hurt within the Church, back to church, I find this passage particularly poignant. This is the first time we are told Jesus had returned to the synagogue, since He delivered His groundbreaking sermon where He revealed that the Lord had anointed Him "to preach good news to the poor", (LUKE 4). In the meantime, He had been out and about in the community showing miraculous signs and wonders from His Father God, but here today He had brought His unclean, unlawful work inside this sanctified space. The leaders were already suspicious of Him and now He stood in front of them and dared to "work" on the Sabbath. Did He have no respect for the law?

This made me think: who is it that I think doesn't deserve to set foot in "my" church? Who do I think will disrespect "my" rules? Am I ready to welcome anyone who Jesus calls into these four walls just as Jesus did.
