Living with dementia at any time brings challenges.

The Alzheimer's Society are working towards a world where dementia no longer devastates lives. They do this by giving help to those living with dementia today, and providing hope for the future.

As part of the action plan for our Benefice Churches for Dementia Friendly Church it has been suggested we publish monthly in our newsletters information which offers help in what 'not' to say to someone living with Dementia. We will be using information from the Alzheimers association website.

Things to avoid saying to somebody with dementia

1. Don't try to jog the person's memory: 'Remember when...?'

While it can be tempting to try and jog the memory of somebody living with dementia, this kind of question may highlight the fact that the person has memory problems. It can also sometimes feel like the person is being tested.

This can be a frustrating or painful experience, and there's also no evidence that prompting the person in this way will help them to recall or hold on to memories. It can be pleasant and comforting to talk about the past, however, it's usually more helpful to lead the conversation and allow the person to join in.

Try this instead:

Instead of posing a question, try leading with '*I* remember when...'. That way, the person can search their memory calmly without feeling embarrassed, then join in if they like.






It started with Hello.....

People are used to receiving messages from unknown numbers, but this "Hello" could be the start of a scam.

Any response, from "?????" "Wrong number" or another simple "hello" verifies to the scammer that your phone number is active. From here the scam could go on to impersonate Police or the Bank, inform you owe a parking fine, be the start of a romance fraud, to name just a few of the many, many other ways of manipulating you into giving away sensitive personal or banking information.



And as a bonus if you do reply, expect more text messages from random numbers in the future. So what should you do?

- Do not reply.
- Do not click on any links.
- Forward the message to 7726 along with the number the text came from.
- Delete and block the number.
- If you have given any personal information report the incident to Action Fraud via their website or by calling 0300 123 2040 and if you have given any financial information inform your bank immediately.

Bishop Sarah's sabbatical

Refreshment:

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ,

I am writing to let you know Bishop Michael has very kindly and generously offered me the opportunity of a sabbatical, and I have gratefully accepted.

As we are reminded, by words in the Vocation and Training section of our own diocesan website: the basic notion of 'sabbatical' leave is Biblically based, the cessation of work principal in Genesis 2: 3 being a positive gift of rest:

'God blessed the day and made it holy'.

In Leviticus 25 we read of 'sabbath years' and the idea that the ground should be left to rest so that it can replenish itself.

During such a time there is a place for extended rest and a change of rhythm, spiritual refreshment and renewal and I will be taking this opportunity from October 1st - January 12th, 2026.

I am so grateful to those who are making this possible and particularly to Bishop Michael, Archdeacon Nick and my Executive Assistant, Carole. During my sabbatical, Bishop Michael will provide cover for episcopal ministry which would usually be provided by me as Bishop of Shrewsbury and people are invited to contact Bishop Michael's office directly during this time.

Whilst on sabbatical I will not have access to my emails and it would be helpful if you could direct emails to an appropriate recipient accordingly. Sunday 3rd August:

We start a series of prayers for Wem and Whitchurch Deanery and especially pray for their parishes in vacancy, and ask that God will be leading the right candidates towards Shropshire.
