#### Luke 12:13-21

#### The Parable of the Rich Fool

- <sup>13</sup> Someone in the crowd said to him, "Teacher, tell my brother to divide the inheritance with me."
- <sup>14</sup> Jesus replied, "Man, who appointed me a judge or an arbiter between you?" <sup>15</sup> Then he said to them, "Watch out! Be on your guard against all kinds of greed; life does not consist in an abundance of possessions."
- <sup>16</sup> And he told them this parable: "The ground of a certain rich man yielded an abundant harvest. <sup>17</sup> He thought to himself, 'What shall I do? I have no place to store my crops.'
- <sup>18</sup> "Then he said, 'This is what I'll do. I will tear down my barns and build bigger ones, and there I will store my surplus grain. <sup>19</sup> And I'll say to myself, "You have plenty of grain laid up for many years. Take life easy; eat, drink and be merry.""
- <sup>20</sup> "But God said to him, 'You fool! This very night your life will be demanded from you. Then who will get what you have prepared for yourself?'
- <sup>21</sup> "This is how it will be with whoever stores up things for themselves but is not rich toward God."

## Keep it simple, keep it real, keep it up

To be human is to pray," says Pete Greig, founder of the global 24/7 prayer movement. "Prayer is the least weird, most natural, necessary, and wonderful invitation. But no one finds it easy. I guess we all need a little help."

We all need a little help because, knowing that prayer is central to our life with God, we tend to turn prayer into a mandatory performance and we overcomplicate it. We try so hard to do it right, believing the better we pray, the more chance we have of getting on God's good side and receiving the answers we are after.

There is a better way though. In *How to Pray: A Simple Guide for Normal People*, Pete Greig shares the best advice he ever got concerning prayer: **keep it simple**, **keep it real**, **keep it up**.

So you won't need any grand words or theology to join the Zoom prayers on Thursday evening at 8:00pm. We meet for just half an hour and pray in simple everyday language for our church and community. Everyone is welcome. If you prefer to remain silent that's fine. There is no pressure to pray aloud, but we would love to see you.
