Training for ministry with older people - Do you feel called to work with older people? Then Anna Chaplaincy could be for you. Anna Chaplaincy is a pioneering ministry within the Diocese of Rochester offering spiritual care and support to older people and their families, including people with dementia. Opportunities available include training to become an Anna Chaplain (lay or ordained) or an Anna Friend. There is also a parish course on the spiritual care of older people. Online training is available from September - download a booklet for more details, or contact Julia Burton-Jones, Anna Chaplaincy Lead and Dementia Specialist for the Dioceses of Rochester and Canterbury.
