

The Vicar Writes..

This year is the 200th Anniversary of St Nicholas' Church, Fulford. However, long before the present building there has been a place of worship on the site since the 13th century. The early church, or chapel, is recorded as being in such a state of repair that, notwithstanding what "...the inhabitants have done...to preserve it in Repair...the same is now in a very ruinous Stae, and an increased population has rendered the Chapel too small to accommodate those Persons which desire to assemble therein..."!

When one looks around and sees a number of parish churches closed and/or turned into homes – such as the Calvinistic Chapel in Vicarage Lane and Wesleyan Chapel at Cross Gate - one would be forgiven for thinking that the Church no longer has a place in our society.

A quick on-line search, however, reveals an resurgence in church attendance in the UK, with notable increases in the Church of England and the Roman Catholic Church. Whilst numbers are not yet back to pre-pandemic levels, these are sure signs of new growth.

So, why, might we ask, is this happening? Well, I think the following story from the time of the American Great Awakening reveals something about the human spirit. It is an exchange between two farmers when one suggests to the other that they go and listen to George Whitfield, Anglican minister and one of the founders of the Methodist movement.

"Hey, let's go to hear George Whitfield preach the Gospel."

The other farmer scoffed, "Why? You don't believe the Gospel."

"You're right," the first replied., "but he does."

Such a simple exchange, but an exchange that reveals something about the human spirit.

In an age of moral confusion and cultural uncertainty, there are more and more people looking for meaning in life, and they are finding this meaning through our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ. So, as we celebrate the 200th anniversary of St Nicholas' Church with our Flower Festival and Photographic Exhibition during August Bank Holiday weekend, do come and join us not only to see the wonderful displays but to come and listen to our very own Jan McFarlane (Assistant Bishop and Dean of Lichfield) preach the Gospel at our Community Service of Celebration at 10.30am on Sunday, 24th August.
