A LETTER FROM REV. CHRISTINE

Hello everyone,

I think this year we can all say it's been a beautiful summer. To me, it's been very special, and I hope you've found it so. I find it special after being in hospital so much last year, and I thank the Lord that I've not been to hospital again but have enjoyed the lovely summer.

It's been a few years since we've seen so many butterflies, and they're so beautiful to see. Brian dashed out at lunchtime to rescue one from a spider's web; I'm afraid he made matters worse by trying to nudge its wings, but the spider had well and truly cut it.

As well as the butterflies, we also have the caterpillars, enjoying the cauliflower and such in the greenhouse. It always brings to my mind the story of the hungry caterpillar, which always makes me smile, not just because my own children liked it, but because of memories from reading and using it in school. As soon as the children saw the book, I set the ground rules: no shouting out until the end, when my arm went up, to say, "It's a butterfly."

The butterflies are used in our faith: the creature comes back to life, just as Jesus on the third day came back to us.

The butterfly's colours are often so beautiful to look at, and yet some of them are very plain, not bright and beautiful at all – but maybe they'll lay more eggs, and we never know what beautiful new life may come from them. They all have their place in the world.

That is like us as people. We mightn't all be the brightest bulb on the tree, but we all have different talents and different mindsets. God makes the butterflies so different, but all beautiful in their time. He made us all at different times, different in so many ways. And God loves us all as we are: all different, all open to meet Jesus at the end of our lifetimes.

No booking needed — just come along... and bring someone with you!


CLUB DAY BANNER

WI NEWS

The August meeting of Freckleton WI was held at the Village Hall on 12 August.

Kathy opened the meeting by welcoming everyone on such a warm evening and explained that, because our speaker had to leave early to drive to Nottingham, he would be giving his talk first.

Kathy welcomed Barry Marsh, who proceeded to tell us a little bit about himself, that he worked in radio and did volunteer work for the Anthony Nolan Trust. He asked, "Why haven't I brought a dog?" It was because it would take all the attention away from his talk, and that they were needed elsewhere.

Claire Guest started Medical Detection Dogs because her own dog started staring at her and nudging her in the chest. She went to see her doctor and was diagnosed with a deep-seated breast cancer. Had Daisy, her dog, not warned her, the prognosis would have been very different.

MDD received a bequest from Sylvia's Legacy, and this took the charity to the next stage. They bought a building in Milton Keynes, where dogs go to be trained by the "find" and "reward" procedure. Barry also said that the Queen was a Patron and met a few of the dogs at Clarence House.

MDD works in two areas: bio detection dogs (smell), and medical alert assistance dogs, whereby the dog lives with the client. The dogs are purchased via breeders and rescue centres, and some are donated. It costs £30,000 to train a dog. The dogs used are mainly spaniels and labradors, and the dog is trained to respond to a particular smell. Each disease has its own smell, and the dog looks for very early detection of disease to give an accurate diagnosis. During the pandemic, dogs could detect COVID.

MDD would like to work in collaboration with universities and the NHS in four areas: cancers, neurological, bacterial and viruses.

The dogs work for 20 minutes, three times a day, and would be very good in detecting hospital infections and urinary tract infections. A short film was shown on how dogs detect the different samples of disease.

The second area is the medical alert assistance dogs – dogs live with the client and alert an oncoming medial episode. There are 100 dogs with clients at the moment.

A couple of films were shown of how client and dog live together. It was a very moving film, and the clients told how they now have a life and independence because of their dogs.

Barry ended his talk by saying the Government and the NHS need to invest in MDD, who now rely on public donations. A vote of thanks was given by Christine Yeoman.

Twenty-eight members will be going on our outing to Bent's Garden Centre on 22 November.

The competition, "A superhero dog", was won by Doreen Norris, second was Margaret Ward, and third was Anne Starr.

There was a Social Half Hour quiz, and then the raffle was drawn.



FRECKLETON HISTORY GROUP

Notes of the meeting of Freckleton History Group, in association with Freckleton Library, on 30 July 2025

Steve welcomed everyone and mentioned that the Love Freckleton Library committee are registering for the usage of Preston Community Transport, which will be available for any library group for outings etc. He then introduced David Kirkby.

David had brought along a ledger that was the account book for a ship called the "Active". This book is 230 years old (1796 – 1820). The "Active" was a 50-tonne sloop, registered to the Port of Freckleton, which is also the Port of Preston and the Port of Kirkham. Robert Hall gave the land at the boatyard to allow for shipbuilding, and the "Active" was built and registered to Captain George Richardson (a relative on David's maternal side of his family). George later owned a ship, which sank on the Welsh coast.

The book shows all that is coming in and going out of Freckleton after the River Douglas was navigated to allow boats from other places to dock. Because of all this activity, the people of Freckleton also got involved with shipbuilding and ropemaking. The import of flax was used in ropemaking. Items coming into Freckleton were canvas, sacking cloth, twine, coal, potatoes, malt, wheat and grains, molasses, soap, vinegar, spirits and wine, salt, fish and wood, etc. The items exported were all agricultural things: rope, canvas, sacks, and also the church bell from Kirkham Church, which was sent to Gloucester. David also mentioned Allenson's Shipyard, where all the lifeboats in the country were repaired.

Michael Lancaster then showed his old maps of Freckleton, which were very relevant to what David had brought along. Michael's grandfather delivered the coal that was brought into Freckleton boatyard. Michael said that the river was straightened when Preston Dock was built. The maps were passed around and were very interesting.

Everyone then enjoyed looking at the ship's ledger, the maps, and various photographs that were brought along.

David and Michael were thanked and applauded for this very interesting talk.

The booklet on Freckleton Shops has been printed and is available from the Library from Tuesday 5 August for a donation.

Our next meeting will be on Wednesday 24 September, 13:30, at the library. Annie Thorn will be giving a talk on "Windmills of the Fylde".

The breakthrough

With the *DIY SOS* build, July was a whirlwind of a month. It was incredible to see how many traders and volunteers flooded in to give their time and resources, sometimes working through until the early hours of the morning, to get our family home ready for Dan. A large share of the money we had raised also went towards the costs. On the big reveal day, a multitude of supporters, brimming with emotion, filled our street to welcome Dan as he arrived for a quick visit to see his new home and meet the *DIY SOS* team. Despite Dan's still severely limited mobility, he even managed to smile, give a thumbs-up and join in with the crowd's rapturous applause. The programme will be broadcast sometime in 2026, at a date and time yet to be announced. Until then, we'll continue to post updates on our GoFundMe and Facebook pages.

Dan's next steps


Our house is ready for Dan to come home. However, before he can be released from hospital, he needs to undergo an operation on his foot, and we need to receive his care package. We can't wait for Dan to come home!

Our little family has always been very close. Dan needs to be at home, where he belongs – with all his friends and family. We feel this would also aid his recovery, mental health and quality of life.

If people still wish to donate, or feel moved to donate when they watch the programme, to help Dan as he returns and adjusts to his new home, we'll be deeply thankful. Dan would benefit from additional rehabilitation and therapies not readily available on the NHS.

It's difficult to find the words to express how thankful we are for all the support we've received. It's truly amazing: where we live is full of kind people. So many single acts of generosity have come together to produce an overwhelming result.





Staff are trained to a high standard and provide person-centred care to people living at the home with dignity and respect.

People are encouraged to make choices and decisions with regard to daily living to promote empowerment and enhance their sense of wellbeing and fulfilment.

The home employs an activity care assistant who takes a personcentred approach to creating the weekly activity program. Regular consultations are held with people to discuss what they like to do in order for people to have positive outcomes and live their life the way they choose at the Old Vicarage.

The home operates an open-door policy, visitors are welcome to join in with planned events. People are welcome to come and view the home without an appointment.

Dear friends,

At the beginning of April, we began supporting four new tuition centres. Three of these centres are located in Bihar, near the two centres we have been supporting for over a year; the fourth is in a refugee camp in Manipur, where conflict has been ongoing. As mentioned in our previous newsletters, these centres bring transformation and provide hope to children from very impoverished backgrounds.





The new centres have already started creating a positive learning environment for children who had limited or no access to education. Our project partner has shared with us the impact the centres are having on the children.

"Across the tuition centres children have shown notable improvements in reading, writing, and numeracy skills. Many can now read small sentences, solve basic arithmetic problems, and express themselves with growing confidence. Beyond academics, our focus on creative learning, storytelling, interactive activities and health and social education has nurtured self-esteem and curiosity among the children."





"We are encouraged to see stronger parental involvement. Regular meetings with parents revealed their appreciation for the changes observed in their

children: improved discipline, heightened interest in studies, and better communication. Our tutors continue to play a vital role by offering dedicated support and personal attention, and fostering a caring learning atmosphere."

"The children eagerly participated in drawing and art competitions, storytelling sessions, health and hygiene awareness classes, and educational games. These creative and interactive events provided a much-needed outlet for self-expression and fun. The activities not only kept them engaged during the summer but also reinforced essential life skills in a joyful and safe environment."

"In recognition of the importance of good nutrition for learning and growth, nutritious snacks and food items were provided regularly at all centres. This small but vital support not only helped improve children's concentration and energy but also encouraged regular attendance. Community-Based Organizations (CBOs) in each village have taken active ownership in this initiative by helping with the preparation and distribution of food. Their involvement has strengthened community participation, ensured local support, and fostered a collective sense of responsibility toward the wellbeing of the children."



We currently support ten tuition centres among our projects. These new centres highlight our commitment to support the most vulnerable children in India, ensuring that each child has access to an education and a hope for a better future, all in the name of Jesus Christ. It is also encouraging to see how these centres positively impact the parents and local community, bringing the people of the villages together to care for the well-being of the children.
