
MacMillan coffee morning



Luke 12:49-56

Not peace but division

⁴⁹ 'I have come to bring fire on the earth, and how I wish it were already kindled! ⁵⁰ But I have a baptism to undergo, and what constraint I am under until it is completed! ⁵¹ Do you think I came to bring peace on earth? No, I tell you, but division. ⁵² From now on there will be five in one family divided against each other, three against two and two against three. ⁵³ They will be divided, father against son and son against father, mother against daughter and daughter against mother, mother-in-law against daughter-in-law against mother-in-law.'

Stargazers had a treat on Monday and Tuesday nights, one of the year's most dazzling displays, with the Perseid meteor shower reaching its peak. The shower lights up the skies each summer, and is known for its bright, fast-moving meteors - often dubbed "shooting stars".

The Perseids come from a comet called Swift–Tuttle, which orbits the Sun once every 133 years. The comet's dust particles enter Earth's atmosphere at speeds of about 37 miles (59 kilometres) per second. As they do so, they burn up, creating the bright flashes we call meteors. The Perseids have been observed for nearly 2,000 years, with some of the earliest records from ancient China.

Evensong Service Sunday 7th September 2025 at 6 pm By kind permission of Hartwell House

This traditional and very popular Common Prayer service takes place <u>out of doors</u>, in front of Hartwell Church. The spectacular and romantic mid-18th-century church was built in the 'Gothic' style between 1753 and 1755 to a design by Henry Keene for Sir William Lee. It is situated in the landscaped grounds of Hartwell House, now a luxurious country hotel. Henry Keene designed the church for Sir William Lee. It is octagonal with east and west towers and is thought to echo the chapter house at York Minster.
