School Admissions

We know the admissions process can feel a bit overwhelming, so here's your yearly reminder: if you're planning to request a church reference or signature, please be aware that different schools have different criteria. Primary schools often look for around six months of regular



attendance, while secondary schools may ask if you're a 'full and active member', typically meaning attendance more than once a month. It's important to check each school's requirements well in advance. If you're unsure, feel free to speak to Rev. Claire Corley—she's always happy to help clarify things.

Please note: aside from Altrincham CE Primary, we don't set the admissions rules, but we are committed to being honest and fair to all—families and schools alike—and will gladly provide a reference where possible.

Reflection on the season: Ordinary Time

Over the centuries the church has developed a distinct rhythm with the high points being Christmas (including Advent, Christmas itself and Epiphany) and Easter (Lent, Holy Week, Eastertide).

So for most of the year, from Trinity Sunday (the Sunday after Pentecost) to Christ the King, we enter into a time called Trinity, or Ordinary Time.

We often associate 'ordinary' with boring, but we end up falling into the danger of devaluing where we spend most of our time in our day to day lives - although we have high points and holidays, actually, most of our life is spent doing 'ordinary' things, some of which can feel rather mundane.

These 'ordinary' things really matter to God, and although we are in danger of dismissing them, God most certainly is not! So during Trinity/Ordinary Time we concentrate on how God affects our ordinary, day to

day lives. Be that at home, at work, in school or elsewhere, what we do, during the week, matters. Some churches will use this long season to consider how we interact with the environment, and it is also the

season when Harvest is celebrated.

It is totally fitting therefore that we end this season with Christ the King, for we are called to make Christ the king in all we do – however exciting, fulfilling, or indeed, simply ordinary it is.

Together, we'll be sending carefully packed shoeboxes filled with thoughtful gifts — and this isn't just a


generic donation. We've received specific details about each child we're sending to, including their ages and interests, so every box can be personal and meaningful.

Frequently Asked Questions!

How much should I spend?

We would suggest around £20. If that is too much, let us know and we can group you together with other people.

Can I request someone of a specific age or gender?

We're afraid not - it just gets too complicated.

Who are you partnering with?

We are teaming up with Grassroots Trust UK who have a partnership with a church in Romania. Although Romania is in the EU there are still many challenging hangovers from its communist days. The rural areas are very poor with high unemployment and a very low wage relative to the cost of living. Poverty is a major problem.

Should I seal the box?

No, keep it open please. We need to navigate customs!

What sort of paper should I decorate it with?

Ideally Christmas paper, but anything nice. If possible, avoid paper with writing on it.

Do they speak/read English?

Unless they specify good English, assume not.

Anything we shouldn't include?

Remember not to include anything anything political, second hand or war related, toothpaste, medicine, aerosol cans, knives, sharp or fragile items.

GOING DEEPER



Joyce Hill is an Emeritus Professor of Leeds University. She is a Christian who specialises in Anglo-Saxon Benedictine Reform and it's impact on ecclesiastical and cultural life, and regularly delivers lectures.

Cardinal Robert Prevost was elected as Pope on 8 May 2025, becoming Pope Leo XIV, a choice of name inspired by Leo XIII, who was Pope 1873-1903. He was a notable social reformer at a time of huge change, when – in a period often called the Second Industrial Revolution (c.1870-1914) — there was rapid scientific discovery and everincreasing mass production, with standardisation of products and processes. The wealth of developed and developing nations vastly increased, but it brought with it much human suffering. In response to this, Leo's encyclical of 1891 was revolutionary in arguing that workers should receive a fair wage, enjoy safe working conditions, and have a right to belong to a trade union. The encyclical also supported free enterprise and rights to property. Not surprisingly, this Pope Leo became known as 'The Pope of the Workers'.

Pope Leo XIV is the first Pope to be born after the Second World War; the first to have been born in the USA; the second to be a native English speaker, after Hadrian IV (1154-59), the only English pope there has yet been; and the second, after Pope Francis, to be from South America, in the sense that he is a naturalised citizen of Peru. He is also the first pope who is a friar of the Order of Saint Augustine, although six other popes before him have belonged to other Orders which follow the Augustinian Rule.

Orders of friars came into existence in the thirteenth century, the most famous being the Order of St Francis, founded in 1209. The Dominicans — more scholarly in their focus than the Franciscans — followed in 1220, and the Augustinians in 1256, with a constitution modelled closely on that of the Dominicans, with whom they share a strong commitment to learning alongside their pastoral outreach. Martin Luther (1483-1546), who can be said to have launched the Reformation, was an Augustinian friar, although he belonged to one of the reformed branches of the Order that had by then developed. Some of these achieved independent status, and so are counted as separate Orders, although they are still Augustinians.

There is also an Order of Augustinian canons: communities of priests (canons) who live a common life of poverty, celibacy and obedience, although they can undertake parochial responsibilities. When living in community, their life is much like that of monks in monasteries, although all Augustinian canons are priests, unlike monks, some of whom are priested, and some are not. Such communities of priests grew up in northern Italy and southern France in the earlier part of the eleventh century. They received formal approval in the Lateran synods of 1059 and 1063, and their way of life rapidly spread in western Europe in the century that followed.

St Augustine of Hippo (354-430), after whom all these Augustinian Orders are named, was one of Christianity's greatest theologians, hugely influential in the development of the western church in particular, but he did not found an Order or write a community Rule in the same way as, for example, Benedict did for monks, or Francis or Dominic for friars. Rather, the Rule that bears Augustine's name was probably drawn up in the mid-fifth century by one of his followers, drawing on Augustine's writings in various ways. It was little used in the early middle ages, but was revived in the eleventh century by the canons, who were looking for a distinctive Rule of suitable authority, and then redeployed for the Augustinian friars in the thirteenth.




