Success - not just in particular tasks, but in life as a whole. The media is full of it - not just the preoccupation with those who've made it in business, entertainment or politics, but also in advertising. Money, property, power, privilege, influence, beauty: these are the things people want, these are the symbols of success.

It's easy to feel dazzled or intimidated - or feel the pressure to join the race to achieve and acquire. But many work very hard yet still find success quite elusive. You can just feel inadequate, left behind.

All of us need meaning and purpose. But striving for a goal I set myself can't guarantee the sense of fulfilment I crave. And though it's nice to achieve something people recognise, my personal worth does not turn on the opinions of others. There is something quite ridiculous about trying to impress people I don't even know. So what am I to do?

To be human is to be made in the image of God. Our fears may tell us God is against us. But Jesus taught us to see God as our father in heaven. That means God is *for* me. At least, he is if I want him to be. God may seem against me if I'm shutting him out, doing my own thing, going my own way. But I don't have to live like that - and even if that's how I've lived up until now, I can change and say sorry and choose to live differently. New life is always possible: that's what believing in Jesus is about.

The more God matters to me the less do the opinions of other people. I find I'm freed from the burden of expectation where money and status and success defines who matters and who doesn't. I'm at peace knowing what really matters are compassion and kindness, truth and integrity, justice and mercy, love and contentment - the sorts of things that spring from a life rooted in a trust in God. Then I can walk tall as a child of God alive upon the earth - and if I'm known by God, who cares what anyone else thinks of me? And once it dawns what life is really about, who cares tuppence for the success they think we all should be chasing?
