What is real treasure?

In our Gospel reading Luke 12: 32-40 this Sunday Jesus tells his disciples not to be afraid for God is offering the kingdom. Treasure is in heaven rather than on earth, because 'where your treasure is, there will be your heart also' (v.34). God is like a master who is ready to serve his own servants – but be always alert and ready, because you don't know when he will arrive.

The Gospel reading makes an astute connection between treasure and our emotions, between what we value and the values that drive us. The challenge is to understand what real treasure is. Real treasure comes from God. This is treasure that will last forever. Yet, it can be found right here, right now; and we find it by looking at what God is doing all around us and joining in the work of his kingdom.

An Answer to Prayer

At the end of May, after being on HRT for a long time, I started to bleed. I went to the GP, she placed me on the Urgent Cancer Detection pathway. I went for a scan, where I was told I had a polyp which was more than likely causing the bleeding. I went to see a gynaecologist who told me that the polyp was almost 3cm big so it would have to be removed under a General Anaesthetic, that day I asked to go on our prayer list.

That Sunday, I was prayed for in church, a sense of peace came over me, and the bleeding stopped, I had been bleeding nonstop for 5 weeks.

On Friday 25th of July I went to the Queen Elizabeth Hospital for the surgery, I took my holding cross in with me. When the surgeon came to see me afterwards she told me that I had a perfectly healthy womb, there was no polyp to be removed, she has taken a biopsy as a matter of course, but she had no concerns about my health at all.

I want to thank you all for your prayers, God has answered those prayers in a way that I could only have hoped for. God is so good, I am so blessed that once

again he has answered prayers where my health is concerned. He keeps telling me he has a plan for me, Jer 29:11 'for I know the plans I have for you' declares the Lord 'plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future' is the verse that keeps popping up all over the place.
