The woman doesn't ask for healing; Jesus sees her, calls her forward, and sets her free. What an image of grace!

Where do we need to be more like Jesus—seeing the overlooked, reaching out in compassion, and breaking through unspoken barriers to bring life?

This week, look around—who might be silently carrying a burden? What act of mercy could you offer today, even if it's inconvenient or goes against expectations? Healing begins with seeing.
