# **Benefice Update**

A year on from becoming a united benefice, things are still moving forward, although perhaps not quite at the pace that we would wish.

#### **Joint Council**

The Scheme for the creation of a Joint Council has been approved by Bishop's Council. This has taken longer than we hoped but means that we can now fulfil the intention to share the development and mission of the Benefice together, as members of both churches start to meet together on a regular basis. The first meeting will be in the autumn.

The PCCs will continue to meet to consider local matters, while the Council will have a broader, benefice-wide view.

We will also need to work out a fair way attributing and, where appropriate, sharing costs such as ministers' expenses and administrative work.

We are also working on developing an online hub where PCC members, office holders, staff and church members with particular roles can share and collaborate on documents and projects.

But most importantly, we will be working to grow our shared identity as the people of God in this place of Crockham Hill and Westerham – what that means to us, and what it should mean to the people around us; how we share the Gospel and join in with God's work for His World. I hope that we will be able start this through a process of celebrating and building on our strengths, which has already been started with St Mary's PCC and will soon start with Holy Trinity PCC, too.

#### **Associate Minister**

Unfortunately we still have not appointed an Associate Minister but we are advertising again, with an updated Benefice Profile. This coincides with a push from the Diocese to advertise Rochester as an attractive place in which to live and minister, so we are hopeful of an appointment in the autumn.

## **2nd Sunday** in September

Our informal worship in September is also the second week of the season of Creation, which is a cross-denominational liturgical season celebrating Creation, our place within it and our responsibility for it. This year's theme for Creationtide is 'Peace with Creation'.
