ensure safety and working conditions for their employees. These farms receive a Fairtrade Premium of 10% for every stem sold, which allows workers to invest in healthcare, education and other social benefits. You can buy fairtrade flowers at

Aldi, Lidl, Co-op and Asda.

ECO CHURCH

Our church recognises that worship resources have an impact on the climate and nature, and chooses those that are as sustainable as possible. For example, we are trying to use local / seasonal flowers; we are no longer using oasis or floral foam in our flower arrangements; and we are planting shrubs which will provide greenery, as well as hoping to grow some flowers for use in arrangements. We will also be trialling some organic communion wine and we use beeswax candles. These all cost us more, but they don't cost the earth.
