Kildale Show

Kildale Agricultural Show has been bringing our local community together with entertainment, events, fun challenges, competitions and good Yorkshire hospitality since 1881, guaranteed to give the whole family a memorable day out.

The show committee is looking forward to welcoming visitors, exhibitors and traders to this year's show on **Saturday**, **6**th **September**, and has organised a bumper day of attractions. It is hoped there will be a record number of exhibits, including those in the new categories for native and primitive sheep breeds, and together with much loved regular entertainments there is hobby horse jumping and the North East No Ghost ghostbuster team.

Other programme highlights include: Wild Geese Field Archery; Professor Dan Children's Entertainer; Cleveland Police & Community Band; the Contemporary Community Choir and Gabriella Pink's Traditional Donkey Rides.

Kildale Show is an important diary event for horse & pony enthusiasts, and the day is packed with different classes including tinytots ridden, junior handler (16yrs and under), fancy dress mounted or in-hand, show jumping for all ages, and in-hand rare breeds. Judging begins at 9.30am.

There is a dedicated Classic Car, Motorcycle & Agricultural Machinery display, with judging at 12 noon across categories including classic tractors and vintage vehicles, as well as plenty of livestock classes showcasing local farming breeds.

To complement all of the above there will be a wide range of trade stalls and plenty of options for refreshments.

Gates open at 10am. Entry £7.50 adults / £3 children aged 5-15 / family ticket (2 adults & 2 children) £20 / free parking on the show field.

Fundraising for St Cuthbert's Church Kildale

BikeRegister

If you have a bike, North Yorkshire Police urges you consider signing up for BikeRegister, the National Cycle Database.

BikeRegister is used by police forces across the country to help identify stolen cycles and return them to their owners. NYP has had a considerable number of positive results since adopting the system earlier this year in the York area.

It's a simple FREE process. Go to www.bikeregister.com to add your bike details to the national police-approved database, mark and protect your bike with one of their security marking kits, and apply the provided warning label to your bike to warn potential thieves that the bike is database protected.

It is hoped that some FREE Bike Register Cycle marking days will be run at Northallerton Police Station from September onwards - the dates will be posted on NYP Facebook page, the NYP website and via the North Yorkshire Community Website email alert service.

The free community messaging service from North Yorkshire Police lets the public know what's happening in their area, as well as providing stacks of safety advice and crime appeals. Subscribe via www.northyorkshire.police.uk and search for North Yorkshire Community Messaging.
