A word for the week. . .

i In both the Jewish and Greek worlds, mealtimes were an opportunity for religious debate, philosophical conversation, and the telling of stories. The Greek symposium was where men of good family (and very occasionally women) could enjoy convivial discussion over a feast. In Jewish homes, the Sabbath meal was the ideal time to linger over table-talk. Jesus often uses the image of a banquet to symbolise the kingdom of heaven. Here he has been invited to dinner on the Sabbath. Luke tells us that he was being closely watched there was anticipation about what he might do or say next. And he doesn't disappoint. He first heals a man of dropsy (vv.2-6, omitted from the lectionary reading), and then lives up to his reputation for memorable, if controversial, anecdotes. He starts by taking a dig at his fellow quests. As he notices people jockeying for position, he produces a vignette reminiscent of the advice in Proverbs. But he turns it into something else: an example of a gospel paradox. The i humility Jesus calls for is not self-abasement, a show of false modesty, or a clever move in a political power game. He advocates freedom from the need for invidious comparisons, a trust in one's authentic self, including an acceptance of one's weaknesses. True humility is being present to each other as fellow human beings, without worrying about making an impression. Then we will experience true joy, true exaltation.
