Are we connected with our creator? The Vine and the Branches John 15

Since I finished college at Ridley Hall, I often wonder how I am connected with God, community, family life, friendship and all sorts of connections and dependence. On many occasions, I feel that I am connected; unfortunately, it hasn't been the case. Human connections, expectations and relationships can vary most of the time. However, John 15 explains how we ought to be connected with our creator.



In that passage, Jesus is the true vine, the Father is the gardener, and we are the branches. This passage elucidates the ways in which God cares for us, whether through pruning or cutting off. It's one of the intimidating, powerful teachings before crucifixion. It brings connection, dependence and fruitfulness, a role model of life, which Jesus is expecting from each one of us.

In this passage, the word 'abide' is mentioned multiple times. Jesus is not referring to a casual, day-to-day connection; rather, He is referring to and wanting us to have a deep, daily-basis-dependent connection. We often discover ourselves, self-satisfied or outwardly prosperous, overwhelmed and flourishing. However, it's not the same where Jesus is referring to 'abide'. It's about the spiritual connection. One day, I had a feeling. Flashed like saying, 'You have been working for me but not walking with me.' That has hit me and made me ponder how I should abide in him. That spark has changed my thought of abiding in Him.

I still remember the pain in labour when my wife was giving birth to our son. It's quite difficult and unbearable during that time. However, the joy of that pain is everlasting. In our life, we hardly let ourselves go through any pains. We do not like to have any pain in any manner. However, Jesus mentioned

the painful process of pruning. The gardener, our Father, cuts away anything unwanted or unfruitful from us. We may not like it, as it's painful. He is not doing it with any anger; however, he wants us to bear fruit and to grow mature.



Recently a friend of mine has lost his job. He has been successful in his career while he was working, as he got a promotion and a salary increment. However, things happened unexpectedly. He was shocked and devastated. During that period of loss, he had come closer to God. Things had started to change; God had started to work on his life, as he had never let God in his life. He had been offered a job, which was beyond his capacity. When we let God prune our life, He will take us higher than our imagination. Sometimes, God removes things or takes us away from our safer comfort zone in order to place us in a better position.

We are called to bear fruit. Fruit is the natural result of abiding. The more we abide, the better we bear fruit. In this broken world, how are we being fruitful to others? Who is my neighbour? How am I being fruitful to our community, our church and neighbours? We are called to read and meditate on his words every day. It's our daily bread. And we are called to act according to His words. Let our knee bow before His throne. Every knee shall bow and every tongue shall confess. Let our life be filled with love, joy, peace, patience, kindness and more.

Jesus is giving us a sobering reminder, saying, "Apart from me you can do

nothing." He is calling each one of us. He wants all of us to come close to him. He desires for us to be under his flock, in his tender care, and for him to be our shepherd. How many of us are ready to give our lives unto him, not for his sake but for ours, so as to bear more fruits? Peter
