

Letter from Rev Michelle Woodcock

Priest-in-Charge of the Beacon Team Churches

Dear Friends,

This summer I walked the first 67 kilometres of the Camino de Santiago - Frances – the famous pilgrimage route across Northern Spain that stretches for some 800 kilometres. It's a journey I've wanted to make for almost 10 years, so it was very exciting to finally begin. I started in France in St. Jean Pied-de-Port and paused the journey (for now) in Pamplona where I hope to return and continue walking on from Pamplona to Burgos next year. This initial stretch is known for being challenging, featuring a significant climb over the Pyrenees mountains via the Napolean Route to reach Roncesvalles. It certainly felt like the road was relentlessly heading uphill for the first two days of walking!! In one sense, I have only just begun; in another, I have already walked a whole pilgrimage.

The Camino is made of small steps: dusty roads, quiet paths, steep climbs and occasional storms. It's also made of companions- people from across the world, walking at different speeds, with different stories, but sharing the same road. There were moments of silence, moments of laughter and moments of aching feet and tired shoulders, as well as one moment of utter despair at the end of a long wet walking day where I couldn't find a bed for the night! I worked that one out in the end but there were tears that day! Through it all there was a sense of God walking with me. At some of the hostels you stay in along the way, the host will gather the pelegrinos (pilgrims) together and ask them to share their stories about why they are walking this pilgrimage. One host, Josef, asked us to sum up our reason/journey into something that could be a title for a book. I said "God has walked with me through fire and brought me here." Maybe I should write that book one day.

That has been my experience of God. I have known him to walk with me through all sorts of fires during my life and to bring me safely through. On the Camino, I was reminded that God can speak through the thunder in the storms and also the still small voice in the morning, guiding, comforting and leading, He doesn't wait for us at the finish line, but walks with us in every step.

And so it is with life. We may not all travel to Santiago, but each of us is on a pilgrimage, through the joys and struggles of daily life, through the questions, prayers, and hopes of faith.

Our parish life together is its own Camino; a journey we share, helping one another along the way, offering welcome, encouragement and bread for the road.

In those 67 kilometres I was reminded again of the sacredness of small steps. Each step brings us nearer to God, whether it feels like it at the time or not. A prayer whispered, a kindness offered, a hand held in grief. These are pilgrim steps, every bit as important as the grander milestones. May we walk this pilgrimage together, listening for God's voice – sometimes in the thunder, often in whispers and trusting that he walks beside us guiding us home.

Bishop's Harvest Appeal 2025

This autumn we are inviting churches and friends across Cumbria to give generously to the Bishop's Harvest Appeal. Your gift will support two practical, hope filled projects with Christian Aid and Church Mission Society that are already changing lives.

What your giving supports

Women in Burkina Faso learning poultry keeping and simple eco friendly farming so they can feed their families and build small businesses. A starter flock of 10 hens and 1 rooster can quickly grow. Each hen can lay more than 200 eggs a year, and sales add up fast with typical income of three thousand to three thousand five hundred CFA francs per bird. That can mean around five hundred and twenty five thousand CFA francs in annual turnover which is about six hundred and ninety pounds. Simple training plus a small flock becomes food on the table and a pathway out of poverty.

Training a new generation of indigenous church leaders in Northern Argentina through the CeFA training centre. In 2024 nine men completed the first year long course. In March 2025 a cohort of 13 women began their studies so that local churches can be served in their own languages and contexts. Students like Etelvina are growing in confidence and faith to lead and to serve their communities.

As before, 10% of gifts to the Appeal will be shared with two local partners here in Cumbria - Cumbria Development Education Centre (CDEC) and Carlisle One World Centre (COWC) - helping us grow understanding and action for global justice at home.


'Donations in memory of the late Colin Chamley raised £1,051 for Prostrate Cancer UK. Many Thanks, Doreen and Family'


