Requiescat In Pace

31st October has become famous as Halloween, heavily influenced by American media especially in recent years...

For many centuries November 1st has been kept around the world as All Souls Day (All Hallows in old English) as a day to remember all the departed, both those we knew and now miss and our ancestors who went long before us. Halloween is an abbreviation of All Hallows Eve.

On the 1st of November we will remember our departed loved ones and ancestors in two ways. At 3pm there will be an All Souls service in church, a guiet and reflective memorial service open to all.

At 4pm we will go outside into the churchyard (weather permitting) and light hundreds of memorial lanterns. The churchyard will be transformed into a living memorial full of lights, shining in the darkness. In some countries, particularly in the East of Europe this is a well established tradition that sees thousands of lanterns lit each year.

We will provide the lanterns, they burn for 50 hours and they are weather resistant with a vented lid. Lanterns can be in memory of a particular person or in general Memoriam.

To sponsor a lantern, we suggest a donation of £5.

You can come and light it and place it yourself or you can let us know the name and we will light it for you.

It would help us to know in advance how many lanterns we need but we will also have plenty available on the day
